#### Why Join Rotary??

Have you ever been asked "Why should I join Rotary?" If so, Richards King, Rotary International President 2001-02 suggests the following 20 answers:

- 1. Friendship: In an increasingly complex world, Rotary provides one of the most basic human needs: the need for friendship and fellowship.
- 2. Business Development: Everyone needs to network. Rotary consists of a cross section of every business community. Rotarians help each other and collectively help others.
- 3. Personal Growth and Development: Membership in Rotary continues one's growth and education in human relations and personal development.
- **4. Leadership Development:** Rotary is an organization of leaders and successful people, learning how to motivate, influence, and lead leaders.
- 5. Citizenship in the Community: Membership in a Rotary club makes one a better community citizen. The average Rotary club consists of the most active citizens of any community.
- **6. Continuing Education:** Each week at Rotary there is a program designed to keep one informed about what is going on in the community, nation, and works.
- 7. Fun: Rotary is fun, a lot of fun. Each meeting is fun. The club projects are fun. Social activities are fun. The service is fun.
- 8. Public Speaking Skills: Rotary develops confidence and skill in public communications and the opportunity to practice and perfect skills.
- 9. Citizenship in the World: There are few places on the globe that do not have a Rotary club. Every Rotarian is welcome even encouraged to attend any of the 29,000 clubs in 194 nations and geographical regions. This means instant friends in both one's own community and in the world community.
- 10. Assistance when Traveling: Because there are Rotary clubs everywhere, many a Rotarian in need of a doctor, lawyer, hotel, dentist, advice, etc., while traveling has found assistance through Rotary.
- 11. Entertainment: Every Rotary club and district has parties and activities that provide diversion in one's business life. Also, conferences, conventions, assemblies, and institutes that provide entertainment in addition to Rotary information, education, and service.
- 12. The Development of Social Skills: Rotary develops one's personality, social skills and people skills. Rotary is for people who like people.
- 13. Family Programs: Rotary provides one of the world's largest youth exchange programs, high school and college clubs for future Rotarians, opportunities for spouse involvement, and a host of activities designed to help family members in growth and the development of family values.
- 14. Vocational Skills: Every Rotarian is expected to take part in the growth and development of his or her own profession or vocation; to serve on committees and to teach youth about one's job or vocation.
- 15. The Development off Ethics: Rotarians practice the "4-Way Test" that governs one's ethical standards.
- **16. Cultural Awareness:** Around the world, practically every religion, country, culture, race, creed, political persuasion, language, color, and ethic identity is found in Rotary. It is a cross section of the world's most prominent citizens from every background.
- 17. Prestige: Rotary members are prominent people leaders of business, the professions, art, government, sports, military, religion, and all disciplines. Rotary is the oldest and most prestigious service club in the world.
- **18. Nice People:** Rotarians above all are nice people. They are important people who follow the policy of it is nice to be important but is is important to be nice.
- 19. The Absence of an "Official Creed": Rotary has no secret handshake, no secret policy, no official

creed, no secret meetings or rituals. It is an open society of men and women who simply believe in helping

20. The Opportunity to Serve: Rotary is a service club. Its business is mankind. Its product is service. Rotarians provide community service to both local and international communities. This is perhaps the best reason for becoming a Rotarian, the chance to do something for somebody else and to sense the selffulfillment that comes in the process and return of the satisfaction to one's own self. It is richly rewarding.
