

The Board of the Rotary Club of Ankeny approved a motion to go ahead with the formation of a satellite club in Ankeny at their meeting on October 11th. The satellite club plans to meet at 5:00 or 5:30 on Tuesday evenings at a location yet to be determined. Their members will be members of our club until they they get

to 25 new members. Then they may apply for a charter to become their own club.

The goals for the Ankeny Satellite Rotary Club are as follows:

- Increase active membership participation in Rotary within the community of Ankeny
- Provide alternative time and possible day of week for prospective new members to attend weekly meetings and perform community service projects in Ankeny that would be more convenient for them.
- Provide members with alternative membership dues structure by not requiring members to pay for meals.
- Strengthen the ability of Rotarians in Ankeny to perform more community service projects for improving the communities quality of life.
- Sue Gibbons, Teri Crist, Steve Wieneke and other Ankeny Noon Rotarians will provide assistance and mentorship to the new satellite club leadership.
- Once at least 25 members have committed to joining the new club, charter status will be completed.
