2013 Xicotepec Project

At the September Rotary board meeting, financial support for the March 16-24, 2013 Rotary trip to Xicotepec was approved. Jane Lamfers, the advisor for the Ankeny Interact club has indicated that she would like to participate in the trip and there are about 10 Interact students that have expressed interest in participating.

The club has agreed to pay the full cost for Jane Lamfers and one Ankeny Rotarian. If Jane and more than one Ankeny Rotarian participate in the trip, the cost for two adults, which is estimated to be \$1,750 per person, will be divided between the adults making the trip.

It was also agreed the club would provide reimbursement to Interact students, that have not previously participated in an Xicotepec Project trip, of \$400 per student for up to 5 students. If more than 5 students make the trip, this \$2,000 will be divided equally between all the students making the trip and completing the assignment following the trip. Each student will need to sign an agreement indicating they understand they will be required to pay the initial deposit and the cost of the trip with reimbursement upon their return from the trip and completion of the assignment and application required by District 6000.

District 6000 expects to have reimbursement <u>funds</u> available after the trip for Interactors. All Interactors who are a part of the Xicotepec Project Team, who have not previously applied for reimbursement, are eligible to apply for up to one half of the expenses paid out of their own pocket. For example: if an Interactor's invoices from the Xicotepec Project is \$1,600 - our club

Please visit our Club Website Sponsors. To place your ad click here. pays \$400 of that and the student pays \$1200 - the student is eligible for reimbursement of up to half, or \$600. Reimbursement is not a set amount or a sure thing - it is an application process based on the student's participation in the trip and completing an assignment and application following the trip. Also, the reimbursement does not apply to money spent by the student on personal items, souvenirs, or meals/taxis enroute to Xicotepec and is dependent on the availability of <u>funds</u> in the District 6000 Youth Fund.

The application for the 2013 trip is expected to be available on line on the District 6000 web site by the end of September.

Golf Ball Drop Final Numbers

All income is in and bills relating to the the "2012 Golf Ball Drop" have been paid. The bottom line was net income of \$4,613. The Rotary Club of Ankeny will be donating 60% of this amount, \$2,767.80, to the Ankeny Service Center. The balance to the club is \$1,845.20.

Total income from the Golf Ball Drop was \$6,970. Expenses, which include \$1,750 in prize money, \$383 for sales tax, \$40 for the gambling liscence, and \$184 for the Summerfest vendor booth, totaled \$2,357. The printing of tickets was donated by the Lauridson Group and the Fire Department did not charge for the use of their ladder truck.

Rotary Foundation Annual Giving

The final numbers are in and the 63 Rotary clubs in District 6000 contributed **\$445,126.65** to the Annual Program Fund which is an average of **\$110.84 per Rotarian**. This was the highest per capital giving in our district's history. One half of this, which is \$222,561.32, will come back to the district in three years as District Designated Funds (DDF). This will be available to our district to be used on District and Global Grants.

The Rotary Club of Ankeny's contribution was \$8,250 which was

\$133.06 per member. This gave Ankeny a rank of 11th for contributions per member among the 63 clubs in District 6000.
