Tom Friedman, Ankeny's "2012 Rotarian of the Year" had the honor of presenting **Dennis Hanson** with a crystal plaque stating he was our choice for "2013 Rotarian of the Year". For those that may have

missed his presentation, here are Tom's comments;

There is an old saying that those who can't, teach and those who can't teach, teach PE. Our Rotarian of the year proves this saying wrong, kind of. Our Rotarian also has trouble keeping a job and living in the same house for very long. You see he has had 12 job changes during his varied careers and lived in 22 different houses. His wife gave me much more information than I can possibly share with you tonight, but I really appreciated the time and effort she gave to me.

Our Ankeny Rotarian grew up in Mapleton, MN (population 1,756 in 2010 AND the curling capital of SW MN) and was shy as a child. So shy that the first time he went to Sunday school, his younger sister had to go with him and hold his hand. He was a multi-sport athlete but basketball was his love. Rumor has it that for a long time he held the record at his high school for most points scored in a single game.

He continued his education and basketball career at Luther College in Decorah. Because of his jumping ability (and I assume not his style) he was tagged by an opponent with the nickname of "frog legs". The name stuck and because of this ability, the Luther coach moved him to play center against taller opponents.

He met his wife during his college days, "on the rebound". He was dumped by one of her best friends, when the friend met a guy who was "doctor potential". Apparently this girl felt that her future was going to be better with a doctor vs. a PE teacher. I would say she was wrong. Our Rotarian was engaged one year later and married 6 days after graduating from Luther. After sending out 75 resumes, he finally got a job teaching PE and coaching basketball in N.

Polio Eradication Suffers A Setback in Somali

Somalia had not had a case of polio for nearly six years but in the past few months, the virus has come back. Now, the East African country has

the worst polio outbreak anywhere in the world.

Twenty new cases of polio were reported this week in Somalia by the Global Polio Eradication Initiative. That brings the total number of cases in the Horn of Africa to 73. The rest of the world combined has tallied 59 cases so far this year. Health workers are worried that the virus could gain a foothold in the Horn of Africa and jeopardize the multibillion effort to wipe out the virus worldwide. Until this recent outbreak, global efforts to eradicate polio appeared to be making remarkable progress. Last year, the number of children paralyzed by polio hit a record low at 223. This year it was looking like there were going to be even fewer cases. The last significant pockets of the virus appeared to be isolated in Afghanistan, Pakistan, and Nigeria.

Then in May, a 2-year old girl in Mogadishu became the first confirmed case of polio in Somalia in more than six years. The number of polio cases in Somalia is increasing by the day says Dr. Nasir Yusuf who leads UNICEF's immunization efforts in eastern and southern Africa. Part of the problem he says, is that the majority of children in Somalia have never been immunized against polio. "We have an outbreak in a population that has been quite vulnerable for quite some time," Yusuf says.

In response to the current outbreak, there have been five emergency polio immunization campaigns in Somalia since May. The Somalia government directs the campaigns, but it doesn't control or have access to vast swaths of the country. Some of the most recent polio cases have occurred in areas that are considered off limits to vaccination teams due to the lack of security for health workers in this region.

The World Health Organization traced the poliovirus in Somalia to one in West Africa. Nigeria is the only place where polio is still endemic. Before these cases in Horn of Africa, the end of the multibillion effort appeared to be in sight. The Somali outbreak is now forcing UNICEF, the WHO, and other international agencies to dedicate vast resources to boost polio vaccination coverage throughout East Africa and parts of the Middle East. These are resources that now can't be used to attack the virus in Afghanistan, Pakistan, and Nigeria, which appeared, until now, to be the last few places where polio had a foothold.

Ankeny Rotarians Donate \$53,518 During Past Year

During the past year, July 2012 through June 2013, the Rotary Club of Ankeny completed donations totaling \$53,518. This includes \$19,800 to complete the club's commitment to the AMP project and \$12,286 to Rotary International for Polio Plus and Paul Harris contributions. Two international grants totaling \$1,000 were also funded. The remaining \$20,432 went to other special projects and organizations in our community. These totals do not include the contributions individual members made to the AMP project.

This level of donations is the highest on record. The total for the previous two years was \$29,278 in 2011-2012 and \$14,735 in 2010-2011.,
