Register Now to Bid on Biker Night



Registration is now available for "Biker Night". We recommend each Rotarian register and become familiar with the web site prior to the the event. To register and get your "Bidder ID", sign on to https://bidpartner.net/rotary/. Then click on "REGISTER AS NEW"

BIDDER". After providing your personal information, click on "Submit". You will be assigned a "Bidder ID". This is the same bidder number that you wil use on Biker Night.

Then you will need to enter your credit card information by clicking on "CREDIT CARD REGISTRATION". You will be asked to enter your email address and then click on "Search". Assuming the information is correct, click on "This is me, continue". Enter your credit card information and you will see a screen saying "Your credit card has been successfully pre-registered for the event!" Now you are ready to start bidding.

To bid on an item, click on "AUCTION BIDDING". If you have logged in, you will see your Name and Bidder ID at the top. If you have not logged in, enter your Bidder ID by clicking on the blue key pad to enter your bidder number. Click on any of the blue buttons to view items in that Click on "Bid by Item Number" on "Main Menu" and enter the item number using the blue key pad. The item will appear and then click on "Proceed to Set Bid". Then click on the green "Place Bid" tab to bid the next incremental amount. If you wish to raise the bid by more then the next incremental amount, use the "Raise Bid" tab if you wish to raise the bid by more than the next incremental amount. You can also enter a "Maximum Bid" amount if you wish. When ready, click the green "Place Bid" tab and your bid will be entered.
