#### Foundation Minute



This story, reported by the Rotary Club of Folsom, California, of a successful global grant is a wonderful example of ensuring the sustainability of a project objective. Folsom Rotarians partnered with two Rotary clubs in Brazil on a \$33,750 project funded through The Rotary Foundation to help the hard of hearing in Brazil. The Rotary Clubs of Candia Mota and Assis Norte, Brazil

distributed 164 hearing aids to adults in their communities. Their Rotary club members personally traveled, sometimes great distances, to give hearing tests to over 200 people identified by a local municipality health clinic as needing hearing aids but not being able to afford them. They then had to choose 82 people who would each receive two hearing aids.

Included in the hearing-aid kits they received were a solar battery charger and four batteries making the hearing aids affordable to maintain. For most hearing aid users, replaceable batteries cost over one dollar a week, which is too expensive for the economically disadvantaged. These solar batteries should last the users at least two years. Also in the kit are storage containers and ear pieces individually molded to the users' ears. Although the Candia Mota club has completed many Matching Grants in the past, they have found this project done with funds seeded from the Rotary Club of Folsom to impact beneficiaries the most.

#### Nigeria Polio Free for Year



July 24, 2015 marks one year since Nigeria last reported a polio case caused by wild poliovirus, putting the country on the brink of eradicating the paralyzing disease. The last case was reported in the northern state of Kano one year ago. If no cases are reported in the coming weeks, the World Health Organization is expected to remove Nigeria from the list of



countries where polio is endemic, leaving just two: Afghanistan and Pakistan. Nigeria is the last polio-endemic country in Africa. The continent is poised to reach its own first full year without any illness from

the virus on 11 August.

"Every Rotarian in the world should be proud of this achievement," says Rotary International President K.R. Ravindran. "We made history. We have set Africa on course for a polio-free future. But we have not yet reached our goal of a polio-free world. Raising funds and awareness and advocating with your government are more crucial than ever."

Progress in Nigeria has come from many measures, including strong domestic and international financing, the commitment of thousands of health workers, and new strategies that reached children who had not been immunized earlier because of a lack of security in the northern states. "Rotary's commitment has been the number one reason for the recent success in Nigeria," says Dr. Tunji Funsho, chair of Rotary's Nigeria PolioPlus Committee. "We have infected political leaders with this commitment. The government has demonstrated this with political support and financial and human resources. And that went down the line from the federal level, to the state, to the local governments."

In June, Rotary announced \$19 million in grants for continued polio eradication activities in Africa, including almost \$10 million for Nigeria. Since 1985, when Rotary launched PolioPlus, the program that supports the organization's polio eradication efforts, its worldwide monetary contributions to the cause have exceeded \$1.4 billion.
