## Honorary / Senior Active Membership Requirements

In an effort to standardize the requirements for a member to change their membership type from **“Active”** to **“Honorary”** or **“Senior Active”**, the board adopted the following guidelines on **April 12, 2011**.

To become an Honorary Member or a Senior Active member of the Rotary Club of Ankeny, the following requirements should be met for a member in each age category:

- **Age 60 and above; five years** of consecutive service to the Rotary Club of Ankeny by an “Active” member in good standing.
- **Age 50 to 59; ten years** of consecutive service to the Rotary Club of Ankeny by an “Active” member in good standing.
- **Up to age 50; fifteen years** of consecutive service to the Rotary Club of Ankeny by an “Active” member in good standing.

The only differences between Honorary and Senior Active membership types are:

- Rotary International (And ClubRunner) does not have a membership type “Senior Active”. This is unique to the Rotary Club of Ankeny. All Senior Active members are classified as an Active member.
- Since Senior Active members are classified as an Active member, Rotary International includes a Senior Active member in the member count for the club while an Honorary member is not included in the member count.
- Honorary members are not required to contribute to the Rotary Foundation for the Club to be recognized by Rotary International as a 100% club.
- Honorary membership are generally reserved for local dignitaries, spouses of past members, or for an individual that is an Active member of another Rotary club but wishes to also participate in the Rotary Club of Ankeny. Rotary International does not allow an individual to be an Active member of more than one club.

Both Senior Active and Honorary members are assessed a quarterly fee, established by the Board, to primarily cover the dues assessed to the Club for membership dues by District 6000 and Rotary International and they will be asked to participate in the Paul Harris program.

Honorary and Senior Active members who are delinquent in payments for two quarters will have their membership revoked.
