


PROGRAM SPEAKER

Shannon Green, CEO Ronald McDonald House Charities

The Mission: Ronald McDonald House Charities (RMHC) of Eastern Iowa & Western Illinois is committed to providing services that directly improve the health and well-being of children while offering a community of comfort and support for families seeking medical care for a child.

From food to lodging to laundry, RMHC provides free services to take away as many life stressors as possible, so families can focus on their hospitalized loved one.

The house in Iowa City accommodates 31 families, and it is always full, with a waiting list. Criteria for use of RMHC is the hospitalized child has to be 21 years old or younger, receiving medical care, and the family must live at least 20 miles away. Plans are underway to expand the current facilities, which will include a 3-story addition attached to the existing house. This addition will add 24 suites.

In addition to the house, RMHC also has Family Rooms in the hospitals and Snacks on the House, which is a 24-hour pantry. Both programs allow families to be nearby, so they don't have to leave their child for very long to eat, rest, or meet other daily needs.

In 2024, 435 families were served, with 68 being families from the Quad Cities and surrounding area. The average stay is 26.2 days, and the wait time is typically 5.1 days.

Funding includes 18% from McDonald's and 49% from individual donors. When ordering at McDonald's, customers can "round up", with proceeds going to RMHC. Special events are held to raise funds as well. On September 16, 2025, the 2nd Annual Golf Gala will be held at Iron Tee. In addition to attending fundraisers and donating, people can get involved by volunteering, doing service projects, and sponsoring a meal.

In appreciation for Shannon's presentation, a donation from BRC to RMHC in the amount of \$100 was presented to her.
