
Representatives **Gary Mohr** and **Mike Vondran** are off to Des Moines for the start of the Iowa State Legislature session which begins on January 13th, 2025.

Our Program:

Mike Ingelby introduced Ty Montoya from the Unity Point senior program PACE which serves those with health support needs above age 55.

PACE here in the Iowa Quad Cities is located at 2119 Kimberly Rd, Bettendorf in the old Hobby Lobby building in Bettendorf. As Penny McGimpsey said, "I visited the facility during the chamber ribbon-cutting and it is just beautiful inside."



This healthcare model puts everything under one roof including – Healthy Aging, Access to Essential Services, Social Activities, On-site Medical Care and Medicine Management. It is NOT 24- hour in-home care, but can provide services in-home during the day.

PACE can provide transportation to local Dr's appointments and even to the University of Iowa Hospitals and Clinics for routine visits.

They have a heavy focus on Nutrition Support, Occupational Therapy & Physical Therapy are essential services provided to help clients stay independent. Adult Day Care is growing in popularity which centers on active engagement, socialization and games. They provide a hot lunch and fill the afternoon with more activities and exercises to stimulate mind and body.

This end-to-end program includes areas for showers, laundry, and coordination of home care. Light house-keeping in the home and helping with general care throughout the day.

The program includes Primary Care Providers and Urgent Care. PACE must provide all of the listed contracted services to maintain its credentials as a PACE Site. They are funded by State, Federal, Medicare and Medicaid in most cases.



As part of the whole package, PACE will arrange for supporting items such as a hospital bed, walkers or other appliances or hardware for support of the patient/client.

It's a Self-Referral process that will grow to a limit of 250 participants!
