immobilized in a walking boot!





There is a ton of progress and activity in the city of Rock Island. Many really outdated and deteriorating buildings have been razed by the city. The old buildings along the river drive, Bear Manufacturing and others have been removed and are ready for new construction.

They have been focusing on homes for Veterans and are celebrating this new project!

The YWCA has a brand new facility on the site of the old Zimmerman Honda location across from Skellington Manor. The amazing facility provides vital services to the community and even has a state-of-the-art pool to serve the community.

Still a long way off for railroad quiet zones along the river, but there is hope!

The new federal courthouse sits on the ground of the old Bituminous Insurance building

in downtown Rock Island. This is a \$47-million-dollar project with seven different federal agencies housed within.

The City of Rock Island is rehabilitating many of the streets and plaza areas in the downtown. They are using Tax Increment Financing, Grants and ARPA funds to great a brand new look at feel in the District of Rock Island along the former RIBCO area down to WHBF. Exciting times!

The Quad City Arts area is getting a new "Arts Alley" with multi-million dollar investments to energize the area.



The downtown businesses have committed to a SSA taxing area to help fund and support their area. They have followed the lead of Davenport and Bettendorf to partner with the QC Chamber to hire a staff person to serve the role of area advocate/manager. Jack Cullen has been in place for 1 year and is doing a great job establishing the place-making portion of the effort

Rock Island is now providing the waste removal services and water purification elements for the RI Arsenal. The are helping the federal facility while also making a bit of money for the city.

The city continues to drive projects forward in the Parks and Recreation Department, renovation of city hall, opening the doors of the Hauberg Center for the community to enjoy, and improving the quality of life for its residents.

There is a lot on the horizon for future development. The site where the Walmart was going to go is being eyed by a developer. A marijuana dispensary is coming to town which will result in significant dollars into the coffers.

Lots of activity with new clubhouses for Highland Springs and Saukie, with great growth in the First Tee program in our area.

Rock Island is going great guns with the renovation of Sunset Marina and the long overdue dredging of the canal and entryway to the marina.

Welcome to Week TWO of RI's Month of Economic & Community Development.

A student from Malawi (East Africa) has arrived in Reading, England, after receiving a £26,000 (\$34,115 USD) Rotary Foundation Grant. Grace Mkangama, from Lilongwe, Malawi, arrived on September 18 to begin her one-year MSc in Climate, Environment, and Development at the University of Reading. The funds, which also included donations from a local Rotary Club, will support her studies. Members of the Reading Abbey Rotary Club will assist Ms. Mkangama in settling into British student life and introduce her to the history and culture of the Thames Valley. Upon completing her studies, Ms. Mkangama aims to return to Malawi to work on programs with young people and small-scale farmers to enhance food production while conserving the environment.

Reading Abbey Rotary Club is one of six Rotary Clubs in and around the Reading area.

Dear Polio Eradication Warriors,

Six new Wild Polio paralysis reported this week. We are now 3 weeks since the most recent report of a child being paralyzed by the Wild Polio Virus in Pakistan.

The Final Two Polio Endemic Countries:

Pakistan Three new Wild Polio cases reported this week. Twenty-four Wild Polio cases reported in 2024. Six Wild Polio Cases reported in 2023. The most recent case had an onset of Paralysis on 09/12/24. One WPV1 Environmental Samples and no cVDPV2 Positive Environmental Samples were reported this week in Pakistan.

Afghanistan Three new Wild Polio cases reported this week. Twenty-two Wild Polio cases reported in 2024. Six Wild Polio Cases reported in 2023. The most recent case had an onset of paralysis on 08/30/24. Three WPV1 Environmental Samples and no cVDPV2 Positive Environmental Samples were reported this week in Afghanistan.


