Welcome to Week THREE of RI's Month of Economic & Community Development.

The month of October is dedicated to Polio Eradication by the World Health Organization. In respect of that, and because End Polio is a Rotary Foundation major project, Foundation Minute will devote much of the report the rest of the month to how Rotary Clubs all over the world continue to work toward a complete eradication of the once dreaded infectious disease. This week's report is from Colombia, South America where the Rotary Club of Nuevo Medellin introduced a special fundraising project. In the current Rotary Magazine report, Brad Webber explains how "Sonia Uribe and her husband, Alberto Londoño, created a stuffed animal collection called El Zoo del Amor, or the Zoo of Love, to comfort seriously ill children and raise money for polio eradication. Sales of Anna the giraffe, Lucas the tiger, and other animals — each wearing a shirt with Rotary and End Polio Now logos — have raised about \$550,000 since their introduction in 2018. In addition to giving the animals to sick children, Rotarians carry them on their travels and snap photos of them at iconic landmarks. "All these animals have traveled, being ambassadors of the Rotary brand," says Uribe, a member of the Rotary Club of Nuevo Medellín and, like Londoño, a past governor of District 4271. Londoño is a member of the Rotary Club of Medellín Nutibara.

Terry's Polio Eradication Update
For the week ending 10/12/24
Dear Polio Eradication Warriors,

Four new Wild Polio paralysis cases were reported this week. We are now 3 weeks since the most recent report of a child being paralyzed by the Wild Polio Virus in Pakistan.

Pakistan - In Pakistan's Khyber Pakhtunkhwa province, Islamic scholars are playing a pivotal role in overcoming vaccine hesitancy, particularly regarding polio. At a recent conference, over 190 religious leaders pledged their support for immunization, helping dispel myths about vaccines being harmful or forbidden under Islamic principles. Their outreach has transformed communities like Bazidkhel, once known for widespread refusal of polio drops, into areas of high vaccine acceptance. Through sermons and personal visits, religious figures have reduced religious-based vaccine refusals, significantly aiding Pakistan's ongoing fight against Polio.

What is containment?

Containment includes biosafety and biosecurity requirements for laboratories, vaccine production sites, or any other facility that handles or stores polioviruses, to minimize the risk of these viruses being released into communities. Containment also concerns risk mitigation measures associated with field use of some live oral polio vaccines. Containment is a key objective of the GPEI's Polio Eradication Strategy 2022-2026, and will be critical for achieving and maintaining a polio-free world.

Afghanistan No new Wild Polio cases reported this week. Twenty-two Wild Polio cases reported in 2024. Six Wild Polio Cases reported in 2023. The most recent case had an onset of paralysis on 08/30/24. No WPV1 Environmental Samples and no cVDPV2 Positive Environmental Samples were reported this week in Afghanistan.


