Bettendorf, Iowa – The Rotary Club of Bettendorf is seeking applications for grants of up to \$5,000 from qualified non-profit organizations in the Quad Cities. Applications will be available on the Bettendorf Rotary Club website on November 1, 2024. The application deadline is December 1, 2024.

The Bettendorf Rotary's grants committee accepts applications once a year from non-profit organizations that provide basic human services, serve youth or meet local community needs. Previous grantees are encouraged to apply, as well as those who have not received a grant previously.

"Even though we are a Bettendorf club, we actively consider requests from qualified organizations throughout the Quad-City community," said Joe Pacha, chair of the granting committee. Bettendorf Rotary generates funds for philanthropic purposes primarily through their Lobsterfest fundraising event.

To be considered for a grant, an organization must complete the online application form – at http://www.bettendorfrotary.com/ – by December 1st.

Grants are not awarded to groups for annual fundraising, organizational endowments, deficit financing, grants to individuals, scholarship funds, political groups or activities, Rotarians and their families, or for sectarian purposes.

The Bettendorf Rotary Club was chartered on May 22, 1957. Over 100 members strong, the club lives the Rotary motto – "Service above Self" – by funding and participating in projects locally, nationally and internationally. Terry's Polio Eradication Update
For the week ending 10/26/24

Dear Polio Eradication Warriors,

Eight new Wild Polio paralysis cases reported this week. We are now 3 weeks since the most recent report of a child being paralyzed by the Wild Polio Virus in Pakistan.

2023-24 Polio Fundraising Results Are Now Final - Thanks to all of you, your club members and Districts for their fundraising efforts for PolioPlus during Rotary Year 2023-24. We raised \$45.9 million to which The Rotary Foundation's World Fund added \$4.1 million. Our fundraising helped us ensure that we can grant \$50 million from the PolioPlus Fund, which the Gates Foundation matches 2-to-1.

For the Rotary Year 2024-25 the PolioPlus fundraising goal is \$50 million. Clubs are encouraged to give \$1,500 or more and districts are encouraged to allocate 20 percent or more of their starting Balance of District Designated Funds. Clubs and districts that meet these criteria will receive a certificate of appreciation. Gates Foundation will match every \$1 Rotary commits to polio eradication 2-to-1, up to \$50 million per year.

The Final Two Polio Endemic Countries:

Pakistan Seven new Wild Polio cases reported this week. Thirty-nine Wild Polio cases reported in 2024. Six Wild Polio Cases reported in 2023. The most recent case had an onset of Paralysis on 09/26/24. One WPV1 Environmental Sample and no cVDPV2 Positive Environmental Samples were reported this week in Pakistan. Afghanistan One new Wild Polio case reported this week. Twenty-two Wild Polio cases reported in 2024. Six Wild Polio Cases reported in 2023. The most recent case had an onset of paralysis on 08/30/24. Ten WPV1 Environmental Samples and no cVDPV2 Positive Environmental Samples were reported this week in Afghanistan.


