

Bettendorf, Iowa – The Rotary Club of Bettendorf is seeking applications for grants of up to \$5,000 from qualified non-profit organizations in the Quad Cities. Applications will be available on the Bettendorf Rotary Club website on November 1, 2024. The application deadline is December 1, 2024.

The Bettendorf Rotary's grants committee accepts applications once a year from non-profit organizations that provide basic human services, serve youth or meet local community needs. Previous grantees are encouraged to apply, as well as those who have not received a grant previously.

"Even though we are a Bettendorf club, we actively consider requests from qualified organizations throughout the Quad-City community," said Joe Pacha, chair of the granting committee. Bettendorf Rotary generates funds for philanthropic purposes primarily through their Lobsterfest fundraising event.

To be considered for a grant, an organization must complete the online application form – at http://www.bettendorfrotary.com/ – by December 1st.

Grants are not awarded to groups for annual fundraising, organizational endowments, deficit financing, grants to individuals, scholarship funds, political groups or activities, Rotarians and their families, or for sectarian purposes.

The Bettendorf Rotary Club was chartered on May 22, 1957. Over 100 members strong, the club lives the Rotary motto – "Service above Self" – by funding and participating in projects locally, nationally and internationally. 



Terry's Polio Eradication Update
For the week ending 11/02/24

Two new Wild Polio paralysis cases reported this week. We are now 3 weeks since the most recent report of a child being paralyzed by the Wild Polio Virus in Pakistan.

Consequential Geographies - Only six geographical areas account for nearly 80% of poliovirus in the world (as of 8 October 2024): Afghanistan, Pakistan, eastern Democratic Republic of Congo, northern Yemen, northern Nigeria, and south-central Somalia. They are called "consequential geographies," are the engines of poliovirus transmission, and are affected by conflict, complex humanitarian crises, remote geographies, and conservative cultures. Tailored strategies are being implemented in these areas including offering additional services to meet community needs, conducting multi-antigen campaigns with polio and other vaccines, increasing environmental surveillance sites to detect the virus quickly, and working to improve routine immunization.

GAZA - On Sunday, UN Secretary-General Antonio Guterres said the postponement of the polio vaccination campaign in northern Gaza was of particular concern as it puts thousands of children at risk. UNICEF has repeatedly implored both sides to allow the second vaccination of the children of Northern Gaza by mid
November to protect the 110,000 children there who were vaccinated with the first dose of Oral Polio Vaccine in early September but have not received their critical second dose.

The Final Two Polio Endemic Countries:

Pakistan Two new Wild Polio cases reported this week. Forty-one Wild Polio cases reported in 2024. Six Wild Polio Cases reported in 2023. The most recent case had an onset of paralysis on 10/01/24. No WPV1

Environmental Samples and No cVDPV2 Positive Environmental Samples were reported this week in Pakistan. Afghanistan No new Wild Polio cases reported this week. Twenty-three Wild Polio cases reported in 2024.

Six Wild Polio Cases reported in 2023. The most recent case had an onset of paralysis on 08/30/24. One WPV1 Environmental Sample and No cVDPV2 Positive Environmental Samples were reported this week in Afghanistan.


