


Happy Bucks

The mission of the Epilepsy Awareness Network is to “optimize the lives of individuals with epilepsy and seizure disorders by promoting community education and awareness, self-advocacy and empowerment, and access to proper care.” They accomplish this mission through: First aid training and community education, support groups, consultation and service coordination, epilepsy management programs, awareness and advocacy events, and youth programs.

Because many people are unfamiliar with seizures or what to do if someone experiences one, the TRUST method is suggested. TRUST stands for: Time the seizure, Remove objects/glasses, Use something soft under the head, Stay calm and remain with the person, and Turn the person on their side.

Annual Fund is the primary source of funding for a broad range of local and international Rotary Foundation activities. Every Rotarian, Every Year (EREY) is an initiative designed to encourage support for the Annual Fund. EREY asks every Rotary member to:

- Contribute to the Annual Fund every year
- Participate in a Foundation grant or program every year

Through Annual Fund, contributions are transformed into grants that change lives. Contributions to Annual Fund are divided as follows:

- 47.5% is credited to the World Fund.
- 47.5% is credited to the District Designated Fund.
- 5% is credited to operating expenses.

The World Fund portion pays for the worldwide grant and programs available to all Rotary districts. Districts use the District Designated Fund (DDF) to pay for the Foundation grants and programs they choose.



