

This Week's Program

Chris Caves, VP of Business Retention & Expansion

Chris Caves' job is to "Grow Quad Cities", and her efforts are directed to economic develop and business retention. Because of the strong history of manufacturing in this area, Chris' focus is often in that sector.

In an attempt to determine what are the most in-demand industries and occupations that pay a living wage, a study was conducted that revealed data helpful to businesses, educational institutions, students, job seekers, and others.

Among the findings were that job opportunities exist for job seekers at all levels of education. Annually, there are an average of 3,300 openings in the top 100 jobs. Ensuring the workforce includes those with the necessary education and/or skill training to fill those jobs needs to be a priority. The community must invest in these educational and training programs in order to position itself for the current and future needs of businesses.



