<u>This Week's Program</u> Gary Mohr, Iowa State Representative

Legislation that was passed during this year's session will become law on July 1st. Representative Gary Mohr reviewed some of those bills, including the requirement for hands-free phone use while driving and the reduction of unemployment insurance tax rates on businesses.

Limiting the use of eminent domain was a hotly debated topic this year. A bill was passed but vetoed by the Governor.

Nothing was done in regard to property tax reform this year, but ideas to address that are welcomed. Gary reminded everyone that collected property taxes do not go to the state; however, many of his constituents have concerns about their property taxes, so the state legislature is working to address those concerns.

According to Gary, the state's financial situation is good. However, there are several areas of increased spending that are of concern. The budget bill currently being debated at the federal level has large Medicaid reductions to come to states. The impact is unknown, but Iowa will be unable to make up the difference. Another area is the amount being spent on the Education Savings Account vouchers for private schools.
