While probably best known for the Riverfront Pops Concert, the Quad City Symphony Orchestra has 30 other concerts each year. Less well known are the many educational programs offered. Through school programs, extracurricular programs, and community programs, the QCSO reaches students throughout the area and beyond.

Symphony Day is a particularly popular event. Targeted for 4<sup>th</sup> and 5<sup>th</sup> grade students, Symphony Day involved nearly 7000 students this year, breaking a record. Every public school in the area participated.

The main orchestra consists of 86 musicians. About 20% are from the Quad Cities, while most of the remaining musicians are from the midwest. The Quad Cities is fortunate to have such a highly-skilled orchestra.

# Rotary Foundation Helps Change the World



Much of the world's population, especially in poor countries, is made up of children and young people. To achieve a peaceful world, it is crucial that the rights of children and young people be respected. Injustices perpetrated against children contribute to the spread of conflicts to future generations.

A 14-year-old student named Malala was shot in 2012 by the Pakistan Taliban for her advocacy for student education. Malala Yousafzai received a Nobel Peace Prize in 2014 "for her struggle against the suppression of children and young people and for the right of all children to education." In her writings and her speeches, Malala's message was: "Let's pick up our books and our pens; They are our most powerful weapons. One child, one teacher, one book and one pen can change the world."
