PV, North Scott, and Bettendorf 55 students are part of the program right now. The EAA chapter 75 are the leaders and mentors of the student build. They are building a 2 seater airplane that will actually fly! The Rotary Grant helped to fund tool-kits, tools, aircraft seats, landing gear, and other essential components. The engine and the avionics systems are going to be installed yet this year as they push toward project completion. This is a Mercedes Sprinter Van that will allow the freedom and flexibility to get into developing and targeted neighborhoods with essential library programs. Homebound delivery is another benefit for the staff to bring impactful services to those that can't visit the physical library.

The Library is also serving as a food pantry with delivery services on a limited, but highly-valuable basis. Even the Library has employment training services so folks in need can be better prepared with job interview skills.



ENHANCING LIVES

- From May 1st through June 5th, the Library's School Liaison Librarian conducted 112 classroom visits to promote the Summer Reading Program, reaching an approximate
- 4,217 students in the Bettendorf and PV districts.
- 199 outreach events were conducted not including homebound & senior living facility visits.
- Ten senior living facilities are serviced monthly.
- An average of 12 home deliveries are performed each month.
- Over 7,000 community members were reached and impacted with the Library's outreach services.

The BRC grant is for "Tools for Change". The group just got a "new to us" van that transports the hardware and gear to the job-sites. The BRC funded the tools and the equipment that will go into the van. Many of the income based recipients are needing safety improvements to the home or help with stairway repairs or ramps.







Polio Eradication Update 8/26

Two new Wild Polio cases reported this week. We are now 3 weeks since the Onset of Paralysis of the most recent reported Wild Polio Case in Afghanistan.

2024 Wild Polio Case Total - 27 -Afghanistan 13, Pakistan 14

The Final Two Polio Endemic Countries

Pakistan No new Wild Polio cases reported this week. Fourteen Wild Polio cases reported in 2024. Six Wild Polio Cases reported in 2023. The most recent case had an onset of paralysis on 07/22/24. No WPV1 Samples and no cVDPV2 Positive Environmental Samples were reported this week in Pakistan.

Afghanistan Two new Wild Polio Cases reported this week. Thirteen Wild Polio cases reported in 2024. Six Wild Polio Cases reported in 2023. The most recent case had an onset of paralysis on 06/26/24. Eleven WPV1 Samples and no cVDPV2 Positive Environmental Samples were reported this week in Afghanistan.

Welcome to Week FOUR of RI's Month of Membership & Extension.

Two Rotary scholars with ties to the University of Virginia will study overseas, addressing social disparities and investigating the intersection of health and the environment. Magdalene Kwarteng, a student in the School of Medicine, will study in Australia, while global public health graduate Hannah Zaveri will be in London. The \$40,000, one-year scholarships are for students pursing graduate studies outside of the United States in one of Rotary International's Seven Areas of Focus.

Kwarteng plans to be a physician who addresses social disparities and the needs of disadvantaged communities, locally and globally. With the Rotary Scholarship, she will study for a Master's Degree in Public Health at the University of Sydney's School of Public Health in Australia. "Incorporating what I learn internationally will not only help with patients that I see back in the United States, but also aid in connecting with patients from all walks of life and cultures." Originally from Ghana, Kwarteng's family lived in Verona, Italy, before moving to northern Virginia.

The other recipient of the Rotary Foundation Scholarship, Hannah Zaveri, of Falls Church, VA, will spend a year studying at the London School of Hygiene and Tropical Medicine. She appreciates Rotary International's interest in health care access. "Their focus on sustainable disease prevention and treatment aligns with my career interests," she said. "I am interested in investigating the disproportionate impact of climate change on malaria and the prevalence of other disease," Zaveri said. "I want to shed light on the reality that lowincome communities are most vulnerable to the negative health impacts of flooding, extreme temperatures, and pollution.
