
<u>Fishers of Men Ministries -</u> presented by Joshua Ngao, member of the Rotary Club of Kenya, and partnered with Davenport Rotary Club locally.

Pastor Joshua Ngao, introduced himself, along with Gary Walters from Clinton, IA, Tom Amery, a fellow Rotary member in Rock Island club, Mike Steen, a great friend and heart of the wells within the program, and Brock Earnhardt, a fellow member of the Davenport Rotary Club.

Joshua discussed that having wells within a community is greatly beneficial and changes a community's life due to currently people walk 30-70 miles for fresh water, so by having a well it would not be needed.

Wells can be two different types. There are currently 6 deep wells that go 350-459ft deep and there are 14 shallow wells that go down around 60-70ft for water availability within the communities that have been helped in Kenya.

There is a water purification building where all water is tested to ensure it is 100% drinkable. .










Fishers of Men Ministries - continued.....

Currently looking at having Bettendorf, Davenport, and Rock Island Rotary clubs come together to help put a global grant together that would be funded thru The Rotary Foundation to be able to put 3 wells for sure and maybe a 4th well, which would cost around \$140,000. Stay tuned for more details from President Mike on how club members can potentially help

Joshua also discussed many other things that the Fishers of Men Ministries do, including helping children with educaton, clothing, feeding them as well as getting them jobs once out of education.

Welcome to Week FOUR of RI's Basic Literacy & Education Month.

With Pakistan still on the list as one of the only two countries in the world with endemic cases of the dreaded poliomyelitis, the current chair of the Trustees of TRF, Mark Daniel Maloney spoke on the continuing effort of TRF to completely eradicate the ravaging disease. In a recent interview with Oonib Azam, a Karachi-based journalist published in The News International, Rotarian Maloney emphasized the necessity for a global effort in funding polio eradication in Pakistan. The Rotary Foundation, he said, was going to continue providing funds for polio eradication. So far, he said, they had contributed US \$460 million for polio eradication in Pakistan, of the total \$2.2 billion that they collected globally. The Foundation, he said, was coordinating with the Pakistani government, the World Health Organization, and UNICEF, in outlining the strategies to control the polio spread in the country. He added that malnourishment was also an issue that needed to be addressed for eradicating polio, as there had been cases in Sindh this year where fully polio-vaccinated children contracted the polio virus, mainly because they were malnourished. "Poor sanitation helps promote the spread of the polio virus environmentally," he said. According to Azam, Maloney explained that the Rotary clubs in Pakistan had worked for years to eradicate polio in the country and they had made great strides. After having only six cases last year and then to have 19 this year was discouraging, but compared to what the situation was 30 years back, "it's a great improvement and we go to continue that improvement," he remarked.

Terry's Polio Eradication Update For the week ending 9/24/24

One new Wild Polio paralysis reported this week. We are now 3 weeks since the most recent report of a child being paralyzed by the Wild Polio Virus in Afghanistan.

Gaza - a total of 552,451 children were vaccinated against Polio. Polio vaccination coverage in <u>Gaza</u> has reached 90%, the head of the United Nations Palestinian refugee agency said on Monday, adding that the next step was to ensure hundreds of thousands of children got a second dose at the end of the September.

Novel Oral Polio Vaccine Type 2 - In a significant step towards a polio-free world, Indiabased vaccine manufacturer Biological E received World Health Organization Prequalification for their novel oral polio vaccine, nOPV2. Joining Bio Farma as the second supplier of this next-generation vaccine, Biological E will help ensure there is a consistent supply of nOPV2, playing a critical role in stopping outbreaks and protecting millions of children from the devastating effects of variant type 2 poliovirus.

Afghanistan - Afghanistan's Taliban-run Health Ministry on September 17 rejected reports saying the hard-line group has suspended or delayed a major polio vaccination drive. Ministry spokesman Sharafat Zaman <u>called such reports false</u> and said there was no official directive to postpone or stop the anti-polio plans.

Instead, he said, Taliban health officials are trying to implement the vaccination campaign in a legitimate and technical way that benefits society.

A day earlier, AP <u>quoted</u> a top official from the World Health Organization (WHO) as saying it was aware of discussions to move away from house-to-house vaccinations and instead administer immunizations site-to-site in places like mosques.

The WHO has confirmed 19 polio cases in Afghanistan this year, up from six cases in 2023, and had announced a sweeping anti-polio drive for September. A nationwide house-to-house anti-polio campaign in June was the first in at least five years, and WHO authorities said the scheme allowed its vaccinators to reach most of the

children it was targeting.

Kamal Shah, a former communications officer at UNICEF, the UN agency responsible for humanitarian and other aid to children worldwide, has urged officials to better integrate the Taliban into polio vaccination efforts. Afghanistan and neighboring Pakistan are the only countries in the world where polio is still endemic.

The WHO has warned that high cross-border traffic between those two countries heightens the risk of polio spreading.
