Today we convened at the Bettendorf Waterfront Convention Center to give 32 local efforts a monetary boost and a pat on the back.



The BRC Grants Committee is made up of Ann Kappeler, Joe Pacha, Shannon Chap, Joe Campion, Greg Blaske, Dick Hanselka, Robert Gallagher Sr., Jeff Hassel, Steve Sorensen, and Carol Foster.

This year this team awarded a record amount of grants to a record number of nonprofit organizations from the Quad Cities. 75 wonderful organizations were considered. Seeking \$189,000.

32 finalists were painstakingly selected. \$80,378 was awarded.

Said President Joe Campion: "We are so pleased to be able to assist these very deserving charities that do so much good for our community and make the Quad Cities a better place for everyone."



Said Grants Committee Chairperson Carol Foster: "We would like to thank all the organizations who submitted grant applications this year. There are many great causes doing important work. We wish we could fund them all."
