QC, THAT'S WHERE





Today we heard from Dave Harrell, president at Visit Quad Cities... the bistate visitors bureau for the QC.

Dave was quick to thank Rotarians Bob Gallagher, Scott Naumann, and Decker Ploehn for "getting it." That being, understanding the importance of investing in tourism marketing.

Dave says he has a great team of professionals at Visit QC. They are professional and purpose-driven. And they include our own Rotarian, Jessica Van Dyke, who manages Sports Marketing. Jessica's current focus is on bringing NCAA championship tournaments to the QC. For example, the NCAA Division I Golf Championship.

The University of Iowa and the University of Illinois are working collaboratively with Visit QC as the home schools for this push.



Another big push for Visit QC is accommodating the cruise ships that stop in Davenport. These vessels turn people loose from all over the world on the Quad Cities – particularly Europeans. Setting up safe, fun, and interesting agendas for these river excursion visitors is going to gain importance going forward.

The BettPlex has become another key draw for tourism in the QC... and that's only going to get stronger as the infrastructure is developed out there and new businesses and features are added.

Funding for Visit QC comes from local units of government via hotel/motel taxes. And the states of Iowa and Illinois provide 18% of Visit QC's funding. But the truly impactful dollars come from the actual visits to the QC by people attending events and attractions and people considering moving to the QC.

"Non-Resident Revenue" is the most critical indicator of the efficacy of Visit QC. \$1.38 Billion was the total visitor spend in the QC in 2022. And bear in mind Tourism provides 9000 jobs in the QC.

Additionally, 253 businesses are sponsoring members of Visit QC.

As with every other agency on Earth, Visit QC is working on programs leveraging Artificial Intelligence. But Dave is emphatic that human connectivity and attentive service will never be replaced in the Tourism formula.

Visit QC is a prestigious marketing organization in that it is ordained as a "Destination Marketing Accredited Organization." There are only 200 such organizations on the planet.

We are all responsible for being good hosts to the people who choose to spend their time and money in the QC. As well, we are obligated to be good ambassadors for the Quad Cities.

Thank You, Mr. Harrell, for helping put the QC on the map.

On Jan. 18, 2024, the World Health Organization office in Abuja, Nigeria, released the following statement regarding Polio:

Rotary International President, 2023-24 Rotary Club of South Queensferry, Lothian, Scotland "Committed to ensuring that every child is safe from the paralysis caused by poliovirus, Rotary International has donated a \$14 million grant to the government of Nigeria to support polio surveillance activities and halt the spread of all forms of poliovirus across the country. The grant, which will be executed through the World Health Organization (WHO) will help to keep the country's foot on the pedal through polio surveillance activities to sustain the gains achieved on wild poliovirus eradication and work towards eradicating the Circulating Variant Poliovirus (cVPV2) from Nigeria.

Welcoming the new grant, WHO country representative, Dr. Walter Kazadi Mulombo, affirmed that "Surveillance is key to achieving health security." Expressing gratitude to Rotary International for the grant, he said the eradication of all forms of poliovirus in

Nigeria is key when discussing health security in the country. The grant will boost work on polio surveillance until Nigeria is through with the goal of eradicating all forms of poliovirus. Work is going on to get rid of CVPVD2, and surveillance is a key component of the intervention.

In his remark, Joshua Hassan, chairman, Nigeria Rotary Polio Plus Committee, said the organization is ready to support Nigeria to eradicate all forms of poliovirus in the country. Mr. Hassan said Rotary Foundation Trustees approved in July 2023 a grant of US \$2,675,000 to support polio eradication in Nigeria through WHO Nigeria for surveillance to track CVPV2. "An additional grant of US \$4,514,785 dated October 2023 was again approved by Rotary Foundation Trustees for surveillance by WHO and finally on the 10 of January 2024 yet another grant was approved to the sum of US \$6,848,002 for technical assistant making a total of US \$14,037,787."
