



and western illinois



Today we had the famous Girl Scouts inhouse. Our own **Shelly Cain-Wells** discussed the significant presence of the Girl Scouts of Eastern Iowa & Western Illinois.

The GSEI&WI council has a huge foot print, covering 38 counties in two states.

The mission of Girl Scouts is to "build girls of confidence, courage, and character." GSEI&WI has 11,000 active girls and 3000 volunteers in its ranks. 4000 girls are in the outreach program.

The outreach program offers scouting training and dogma in the school setting... thus giving program access to girls who don't have the resources to enjoy standard membership.

GSEI&WI has three camps in Iowa that accommodate the scouts' special events: Camp Liberty/QC, Camp Little Cloud/Dubuque, and Camp L-Kee-Ta/Burlington.

Besides life skills, the girls are guided to community service, such assisting with safety patrol and clean-up efforts at schools. The girls with us today showed off their badges.

Of course, The Cookies are the programmatic all-star of Girl Scouts. 55% of the GSEI&WI budget comes from selling cookies.

Girls learn goal-setting, decision-making, money management, business ethics, and people skills from selling The Cookies.

But it's not all work. The girls have taken a trip to Savanah, GA with cookie sales proceeds... and are planning a trip to Alaska.

GSEI&WI typically sells 1,000,000 boxes of cookies in a selling season! (you read that right... ONE MILLION)

And the girls had their selling shoes on today. They had a sales booth set up right next to the FRONT door!



Rotary International...Rotary Foundation Minute

Happy Celebration to ALL WOMEN in Rotary and Around the World!

In recognition of International Women's Day, this week's Foundation Minute is dedicated to the recipient of the 2024 Rotary International Sylvia Whitlock Leadership Award: Manjoo Phadke.

Phadke, a member of the Rotary Club of Pune Deccan, India, has pursued numerous initiatives to support women's health, including organizing clinics to offer medical checkups and mammograms and leading campaigns to promote menstrual hygiene.

Phadke is responsible for securing a Rotary Foundation Grant of \$800,000 to pay for vaccinations for which she aggressively negotiated directly with the vaccine suppliers, ultimately saving two-thirds off the final cost per vaccine.

This phenomenal Rotarian has improved the lifestyle of Indian girls and women through various other programs she initiated including, Project Asmita, her district's signature initiative which uses specially made videos and booklets to educate girls in life skills such as financial, digital, and legal literacy, as well as self-defense, nutrition, and menstrual health. The project has distributed free vitamins and sanitary pads to more than 100,000 girls and women.

Another initiative is SkillArbor, a vocational institute for lower-income students. The institute takes a "learn while you earn" approach, connecting participants with employers on their first day in the program.

As an entrepreneur herself, Phadke says she has a special interest in helping women who want to run their own businesses. Her district recruited about 1,000 girls for a driver's education program that enabled the participants to go into business as delivery drivers. "We thought that if girls can be taught to drive, they can be employed as delivery girls for supply chain companies.

Phadke has conducted free workshops for women entrepreneurs and advises women on legal matters, financial issues, and conflict resolution.

"Unfortunately, in India, women have this tendency of neglecting themselves. For example, if there is one liter of milk, women think it should be given to the men or the boys.
