Polio Update

A bivalent Polio vaccine has been introduced in Afghanistan. The vaccine has been developed to stop the transmission of the type 1 and type 3 wild polio viruses simultaneously. According to the World Health Organization, WHO, the vaccine is intended for introduction in India and Nigeria by late January and is expected to be "a critical new tool" in the Global Polio Eradication Initiative.

The last recorded polio case in Pakistan was January 7, 2010, Afghanistan, January 6, 2010, India, January 5, 2010, and Nigeria November 20, 2009. To date, only 7 new cases have been recorded world wide. Now that is progress!!! We will see an end to this terrible disease. Thank You Rotary!

An estimated 1.5 million childhood deaths have been averted since 1998 by Rotary's administration of vitamin A during polio National Immunization Days. Vitamin A deficiency can lead to blindness, increased risk of infection, and a 25% greater risk of dying from childhood diseases such as measles, malaria, and diarrhea.
