Matching Grants. Jehovah Jireh Haven for Destitute Children is an orphanage in Port Alfred, South Africa, which was home to 57 AIDS orphans living in four small rooms. The orphanage had one small bathroom and no clean water. Because of a Rotary Foundation Matching Grant, the children at Jehovah Jireh now have hope. New beds, more commodes and showers, playground equipment, a commercial washing machine, and new kitchen equipment were added. Additionally, a greenhouse for growing their own vegetables was built. Best of all, the children have clean water. We bring **hope** to children when we contribute to the Annual Programs Fund of The Rotary Foundation.
