The largest amount of funds ever have been budgeted for Matching Grants for this year.

As of July 14, 2010, there has only been -5- cases of wild polio in Nigeria for this calendar year. Last year at the same time frame there were 343 cases.

Through July 17, 2010 there have been only 24 cases of wild polio since the beginning of the year in all of India.

The reasons why the above 2 points are so exciting and encouraging, and that our final goal is now within reach over the next few years, hopefully, are:

- a) Newer vaccines that are working
- b) Better plans and schemes to get the drops into the mouths of children
- c) The tenacity and extra ordinary efforts of Rotarians in India and Nigeria
- d) The governments of Nigeria and India giving strong support as well as collaborating with Rotary and our global partners
