Foundation News

The Rotary Foundation Board of Trustees has selected Sweden's Uppsala University to host a new Rotary Center for International Studies in peace and conflict resolution. It joins the existing Rotary Peace Centers in Argentina, Australia, England, Japan, Thailand, and the United States.

Uppsala University already has a two-year master's program in peace and conflict studies and a research program led by a large, internationally recognized faculty. The Uppsala Data Program will allow future Rotary Peace Fellows to combine theory with data-driven field research. The university is also home to the Dag Hammarskjöld Library for peace research.

The Rotary Peace Centers program offers up to 110 applicants a year the opportunity to pursue either a master's degree or certificate in studies related to peace and conflict resolution.
