Internet contract accepted

CLINTON — The Eagle Point Park lodge will soon get Internet service in an effort to draw in more weekday renters.

The Clinton City Council on Tuesday approved 7-0 a five-year contract with Mediacom to install and provide Internet at the lodge. The city will pay \$300 per month over five years for a 20 Mbps upload and download connection.

The final contract has come a long way since the deal was initially proposed in February. The original contract included a \$25,000 installation fee and was at a rate of \$500 per month.

FULTON III. — Fulton Tourism Director Regina Lehman is expecting a big turnout for the first-ever Zombie Crawl in May.

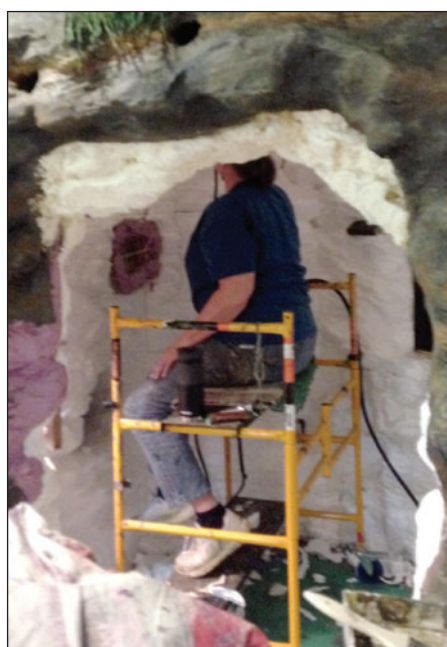
So far, sign-ups have included about 50 people, Lehman said.
