AFTER A VERY FUN FELLOWSHIP FROM GARY FOSTER, OUR PRESENTATION BEGAN WITH JIM MARSHALL, PLANT MANAGER FROM NESTLE-PURINA IN CLINTON.

JIM IS A CLINTON NATIVE AND BROKE DOWN SPECIAL DETAILS OF WHAT NESTLE-PURINA DOES, BOTH IN TERMS OF PRODUCTS AND WITHIN THE COMMUNITY. THE CLINTON LOCATION IS THE LAUNCH SITE FOR DRY AND TREAT PRODUCTS FOR ANIMALS. NESTLE-PURINA PRODUCES OVER 200 PRODUCTS, OF WHICH 93% ARE ONLY PRODUCED IN CLINTON! ADDITIONALLY, NESTLE-PURINA HAS CREATED A CAT FOOD CALLED LIVECLEAR, THAT HELPS WITH CAT ALLERGIES! NESTLE-PURINA HAS ALSO HIRED OVER 150 PEOPLE IN 2020 AND DONATES AROUND \$26,000 ANNUALLY WITHIN CLINTON. THANKS, JIM AND NESTLE-PURINA!

FOUNDATION MINUTE

WELCOME TO WEEK 4 OF ROTARY INTERNATIONAL'S MONTH OF TRANSITION.

WOMEN OLDER THAN 40 ARE USED TO HEARING THE ADVICE FROM DOCTORS TO UNDERGO AN ANNUAL MAMMOGRAM TO SCREEN FOR POSSIBLE BREAST CANCER. IT'S A POTENTIALLY LIFESAVING TEST, BUT ALSO ONE THAT INVOLVES A SOMETIME PAINFUL COMPRESSION OF THE BREAST – A FACT THAT DETERS SOME WOMEN FROM GETTING THE PROCEDURE. NOW, NEW TECHNOLOGY IS TRYING TO MAKE THE TEST LESS PAINFUL AND MORE COMFORTABLE. SOME SOUTHWEST PENNSYLVANIA ROTARY CLUBS HAVE HELPED TO BRING THIS TECHNOLOGY TO LOCAL PATIENTS. ROTARY CLUBS FROM BELLE VERNON, CHARLEROI, MONESSEN/ROSTRAVER, MONONGAHELA, PLEASANT HILLS AND WEST NEWTON POOLED THEIR RESOURCES AND RECEIVED A MATCHING GRANT MONEY FROM TRF FOR DONATION TO THE MONONGAHELA VALLEY HOSPITAL HEALTHPLEX. THE \$10,000 TRF GRANT CONTRIBUTED TO THE OVERALL COST OF A NEW BREAST IMAGING TECHNOLOGY. THE HOLOGIC R SMARTCURVETM BREAST STABILIZATION SYSTEM WILL PROVIDE WOMEN WITH A MORE COMFORTABLE MAMMOGRAM WITHOUT COMPROMISING THE ACCURACY OF THEIR IMAGING.

Dear Polio Eradication Warriors,

No new Wild Polio cases reported this week!

What is that Polio Picture? The Global Polio Eradication Initiative is focusing on 'every missed child' in Pakistan, ensuring even the most vulnerable communities are served with vaccination services. This week's picture shows what it takes to reach the most remote children.

A Win Against Polio is a Win For Global Health! 2021 Circulating Vaccine Derived Polio Case Total - 160 Afghanistan - 42 (308 in 2020), Angola - 0 (3 in 2020), Benin - 2 (3 in 2020), Burkina Faso - 1 (65 in 2020), Cameroon - 0 (7 in 2020), CAR - 0 (4 in 2020), Chad - 0 (99 in 2020), Congo - 2 (2 in 2020), Cote d' Ivoire - 0 (61 in 2020), DRC - 9 (81 in 2020), Ethiopia - 6 (36 in 2020), Ghana - 0 (11 in 2020), Guinea - 6 (44 in 2020), Liberia - 3 (0 in 2020), Madagascar - 6 (2 in 2020), Mali - 0 (48 in 2020), Malaysia - 0 (1 in 2020), Niger - 0 (10 in 2020), Nigeria - 31 (8 in 2020), Pakistan - 8 (135 in 2020), Philippines - 0 (1 in 2020), Senegal - 12 (0 in 2020) ,Sierra Leone - 4 (10 in 2020), Somalia - 0 (13 in 2020), South Sudan - 9 (50 in 2020), Sudan - 0 (58 in 2020), Tajikistan - 16 (1 in 2020), Togo - 0 (9 in 2020), and Yemen - 3 (33 in 2020),

A total of 1,103 Vaccine Derived Polio cases were reported in 26 countries in 2020.

- Pakistan No new Wild Polio cases reported this week. One Wild Polio case reported in 2021. The most recent case had an onset of paralysis on 1/27/21. Pakistan reported 84 Wild Polio cases in 2020. No WPV1 & cVDPV2 Positive Environmental Samples were reported this week in Pakistan.
- Afghanistan No new Wild Polio cases reported this week. One Wild Polio case reported in 2021 The most recent case had an onset of paralysis on 1/01/21. Afghanistan reported 56 Wild Polio cases in 2020. No WPV1 & cVDPV2-Positive Environmental Samples were reported this week in Afghanistan.
