WATCH OUR MEETING HERE

During President Braydon's year as the Rotary Club of Clinton's President, he wanted to focus his Presidential project on highlighting nonprofits around Clinton County. Each month, we will hear from local nonprofits and what they do. This week, we got to hear from Regan Michaelsen, who is the Director of Information, Referral & Assistance Services (IRAS).

On May 11, the FEMA funding for homelessness during COVID ran out. The need in Clinton and Clinton County is very high and a lot of the stuff that we were able to fall back on is going away. As Andy Green stated, when introducing Michaelsen, "The need is up and the money is down." Michelsen has been with IRAS since 2003 and as director since 2008. Though there have been a lot of changes to the organization, the mission has stayed the same -- to serve the people in our community.

IRAS assists in rental and utility assistance and emergency shelter when possible. During COVID, they were able to help 200-300 people with these services, but since May, they haven't been able to due to funding. However, they are still able to help with the "gaps in service" for people. IRAS does not get funding from the state or federal funds, which does give them some flexibility in being able to help people.

One of the many changes over the years has been merging with the Benevolent Society. IRAS is now the largest food pantry in Clinton. Through the pandemic, we lost all but two of the food pantries in town. Michaelsen stated, August 14 Meeting: \$158 On a monthly basis, we're serving about 300 people a month. Last year we saw a Donations to the Foundation: 300% increase in how many people we were serving, that were coming in that for a need for food, so that need is huge. This year, I think by the time we finish our fiscal year in September, we'll see about a 60 percent increase compared to the year before." IRAS also has a Backpack Buddy program, which services around 170-180 kids every weekend throughout the school year, and a Mentoring program, which helps connect people to prescription medication through MercyOne.


