FOUNDATION MINUTE

WELCOME TO WEEK 2 OF RI'S MONTH OF MEMBERSHIP & EXTENSION.

IN HER MAIDEN VISIT FEW DAYS AGO TO PAKISTAN, HOME OF OVER 400 ROTARY CLUBS, JENNIFER JONES, THE PRESIDENT OF ROTARY INTERNATIONAL, AND FORMER CO-CHAIR OF END POLIO NOW, COMMENDED THE COUNTRY FOR ITS COOPERATION WITH ROTARY, THROUGH ITS FOUNDATION, IN FIGHTING POLIO. SHE OBSERVED THAT WHILE ROTARY HAS CONTRIBUTED IMMENSELY TO THE ERADICATION OF POLIOMYELITIS FROM MUCH OF THE GLOBE, PAKISTAN STILL REMAINS ONE OF TWO COUNTRIES WHERE THE DISEASE HAS YET TO BE COMPLETELY EXTERMINATED. YET, THE COUNTRY HAS BEEN ON THE RECEIVING END OF TRF'S LARGESSE IN THE AREA OF DISEASE PREVENTION AND TREATMENT.

FOR EXAMPLE, THROUGH TRF'S GLOBAL GRANTS, THE PAKISTANI CLUBS HAVE PROVIDED VENTILATORS, WASTE MANAGEMENT SYSTEM AND ARE EXPERIMENTING WITH MANGROVE PLANTATION. PRESENTING THE "SERVICES TO HUMANITY AWARD" TO THE JANG GROUP, AN ORGANIZATION WHICH HAS WORKED WITH ROTARY IN PERFORMING FREE HEART SURGERIES TO OVER 250 UNDERPRIVILEGED CHILDREN, JONES SAID THAT OVER 1.4 MILLION ROTARIANS ARE DOING THEIR BEST TO IMPROVE THE QUALITY OF LIVES OF THE PEOPLE IN THEIR COMMUNITIES. "ROTARY'S POLIOPLUS INVESTMENT IN PAKISTAN FOR POLIO ERADICATION IS \$353.8 MILLION AND OVERALL, ITS GLOBAL CONTRIBUTION HAS BEEN AROUND \$2.5 BILLION." ROTARY, SHE SAID, IS COMMITTED TO KEEP CONTRIBUTING UNTIL THE WORLD BECOMES POLIO-FREE. "WE ARE A UNITED FRONT IN GETTING RID OF POLIO," SHE SAID, ADDING THAT THEY NEED TO MAKE IMMUNIZATION WORKERS SAFE IN PAKISTAN. "WE NEED TO MAKE SURE THAT MOTHERS WHO DO DOOR-TO-DOOR CAMPAIGNS ARE SAFE," SHE STRESSED.
