

ON MONDAY, WE HAD THE HONOR OF MEETING WITH THE NEW ACTIVITIES DIRECTOR, KEVIN BEHR, AND HEAD FOOTBALL COACH, NATE HERRIG. KEVIN BEHR STARTED OUR PRESENTATION OFF, DISCUSSING HIS ROLE AS DIRECTOR OF ATHLETICS AND ACTIVITIES. ONE OF THE THINGS HE IS WORKING ON IS GETTING KIDS INVOLVED IN ACTIVITIES AT A YOUNGER AGE, WHICH WILL HOPEFULLY GET THEM INTERESTED IN LIKING SCHOOL. ADDITIONALLY, BEHR DISCUSSED HOW THE COACHES ARE WORKING ON GARY DELACY'S INITIATIVE OF 'CAPTURING KIDS' HEARTS,' WHERE THERE IS A HUGE FOCUS ON BUILDING RELATIONSHIPS WITH THE KIDS. "JUST BUILDING ON THAT RELATIONSHIP WITH THE KIDS AND MAKING A BOND WITH THEM. LETTING THEM KNOW THEY HAVE ADVOCATES OUT THERE FOR THEM AND SOMEONE THEY CAN TRUST AND WORK WITH."

NATE HERRIG SPOKE ABOUT CHALLENGING THE STUDENTS IN AND OUTSIDE OF THE FIELD. "IN-HOUSE, WE TRY TO FOCUS ON ONE DAY, ONE PRACTICE, EVERY SINGLE DAY, ONE THING AT A TIME. IF YOU GO ABOUT YOUR LIFE THAT WAY, I THINK YOU'RE GOING TO END UP BEING VERY SUCCESSFUL AND THAT'S HOW WE PREACH THIS TO OUR KIDS. YOU'RE GOING TO HAVE TO SHOW UP EVERY SINGLE DAY. YOU MIGHT NOT ALWAYS FEEL THE BEST, YOUR TUMMY MIGHT HURT, YOUR TOE MIGHT HURT, YOUR GIRLFRIEND MIGHT HAVE BROKEN UP WITH YOU, BUT YOU GOTTA SHOW UP AND WORK HARD, EVERY SINGLE DAY." THE MANTRA, OR PROGRAM THEME, IS "WIN FOREVER." HERRIG STATED THIS REFLECTS INTO MORE THAN BEING A BETTER FOOTBALL PLAYER, BUT BUILDS RESILIENT KIDS AND HELPS THEM BE A BETTER PERSON. "WE HAVE THEMES OF THE WEEK, WE HAVE LIVE TALKS EVERY SINGLE DAY AFTER PRACTICE. WE HAVE ALL OF THESE DIFFERENT THINGS -- IT'S KIND OF LIKE A CLASSROOM OUTSIDE OF A CLASSROOM FOR KIDS...I TRY TO HAVE A DIFFERENT COACH SPEAK ALMOST EVERY SINGLE WEEK ON THE THEME BECAUSE IF IT'S JUST ME UP THERE, TALKING, SOMETIMES IT LOSES ITS VALIDITY." THANK YOU, TO KEVIN AND NATE FOR THEIR ROLE IN HELPING THE FUTURE OF CLINTON!

#### FOUNDATION MINUTE

WELCOME TO WEEK 3 OF RI'S MEMBERSHIP & EXTENSION MONTH.

THE ROTARY FOUNDATION DISASTER RESPONSE GRANT IS A GRANT OPPORTUNITY PROVIDED BY THE ROTARY FOUNDATION TO SUPPORT DISASTER RELIEF AND RECOVERY EFFORTS IN AREAS DEVASTATED BY NATURAL DISASTERS. GRANT FUNDS ARE USED TO PROVIDE BASIC ITEMS SUCH AS WATER, FOOD, MEDICINE AND CLOTHING. THE PIKEVILLE ROTARY CLUB (KY) RESPONDED TO THE RECENT DEVASTATING EASTERN KENTUCKY FLOODING BY SETTING UP A DISASTER COMMITTEE UNDER THE LEADERSHIP OF PDG AND CHAIR OF THE DISTRICT FOUNDATION, DR. RAKESH SACHDEVA. "WE GOT A TREMENDOUS RESPONSE," SACHDEVA SAID. "WE MADE THE CALL TO ACTION AND WITHIN TWO WEEKS, PEOPLE NATIONWIDE BEGAN TO RESPOND." AT THE END OF ITS EFFORTS, AND WITH ENCOURAGEMENT FROM RI PRESIDENT, JENNIFER JONES, THE PIKEVILLE ROTARY CLUB QUALIFIED FOR TRF DISASTER RELIEF GRANT OF \$25,000. "WHEN I SAW THE HUGE SEMIS PULL INTO THE UNLOADING AREA PACKED WITH GOODS FOR DISASTER AID," CLUB PRESIDENT, KAY HAMMOND SAID. "I WAS SO PROUD TO BE A ROTARIAN. IT HAS BEEN A GREAT EFFORT. THANK YOU, ROTARIANS, FOR REACHING OUT TO HURTING FLOOD VICTIMS IN EASTERN KENTUCKY."

DR. RAKESH SACHDEVA BELIEVES THAT COMPASSION FOR ONE ANOTHER "IS WHAT CONNECTS US ALL AS HUMAN BEINGS; THE SUPPORT WE HAVE RECEIVED ALL OVER THE NATION FOR OUR NEIGHBORS IN EASTERN KENTUCKY HAS BEEN VERY GENEROUS... "IT'S SO IMPORTANT TO GIVE TO THE COMMUNITY. MUCH IS ASKED OF THOSE TO WHOM MUCH IS GIVEN. BUT, NOT JUST IN TERMS OF FINANCES, BUT IN TERMS OF DAY-TO-DAY SECURITY. THERE ARE THOUSANDS OF PEOPLE WHO LOST EVERYTHING, WE NEED TO HELP THEM IN THEIR HOUR OF NEED. IT IS EXPECTED OF US AS GOOD HUMAN BEINGS."

IN HER OWN STATEMENT, DR. SEEMA SACHDEVA IS PRAGMATIC, YET HOPEFUL. "THE ROAD TO RECOVERY IS EXPECTED TO BE PAINFUL AND PROTRACTED AS THESE ARE UNUSUAL TIMES THAT ARE BEING MET BY UNUSUAL ACTS OF KINDNESS BY FELLOW ROTARIANS."
