WATCH OUR
MEETING HERE

FELLOW ROTARIAN, BRIAN KELLY PRESENTED TO OUR CLUB ON MONDAY AND DISCUSSED THE UPCOMING UPDATES AT CLINTON COMMUNITY COLLEGE. KELLY BEGAN THE PRESENTATION BY DISCUSSING SOME STATISTICS AND DEMOGRAPHICS ABOUT COMMUNITY COLLEGES IN AMERICA, INCLUDING THAT THERE ARE OVER 1,000 COMMUNITY COLLEGES IN THE UNITED STATES! CURRENTLY, THERE ARE ABOUT 70% PART-TIME STUDENTS AT CCC AND 30% ARE FULL-TIME. ADDITIONALLY, EASTERN IOWA COMMUNITY COLLEGES DEMOGRAPHICS SHOW THAT ABOUT 65% ARE WOMEN AND 35% ARE MEN. THE AVERAGE AGE OF THE COMMUNITY COLLEGE STUDENT NATIONWIDE IS 27, WHEREAS, AT EICC, IT'S ABOUT 21. KELLY DISCUSSED SOME ADVICE HE TELLS PEOPLE WHO ARE DEBATING GOING TO COLLEGE. "WHAT I WOULD ALWAYS TELL STUDENTS IS THAT THE DIFFERENCE BETWEEN AN ASSOCIATE'S DEGREE AND HIGH SCHOOL EDUCATION ON AVERAGE IS THAT YOU MAKE TWENTY-FIVE THOUSAND DOLLARS MORE A YEAR. OVER THE COURSE OF A 40-YEAR PROFESSIONAL CAREER, THAT'S A MILLION DOLLARS. A MILLION DOLLARS FOR THAT INVESTMENT IS A PRETTY HEFTY RETURN." KELLY TOUCHED ON THE COST OF CLINTON COMMUNITY COLLEGE AND STATED THAT MANY STUDENTS ARE ATTENDING AT NO-TO-LOW COST.

KELLY DISCUSSED THE EXPANSION OF CAREER AND TECHNICAL OPPORTUNITIES AND FACILITIES IN THE AREA, WHICH WAS A NECESSITY FOR THE COMMUNITY. "WHY DID WE DO THIS? SIXTY-FIVE PERCENT OF THE JOBS IN THIS COMMUNITY REQUIRE SOME SORT OF POST-SECONDARY EDUCATION. IT DOESN'T HAVE TO BE A DEGREE -- IT CAN BE SOME TRAINING, IT CAN BE A CERTIFICATE, IT CAN BE COURSEWORK BUT WE KNOW THAT 65 PERCENT OF THE JOBS IN THIS COMMUNITY REQUIRE SOME POST-SECONDARY CREDENTIAL." BETWEEN 20-40% OF RECENT HIGH SCHOOL GRADUATES DO NOT PURSUE ANY EDUCATION OR TRAINING BEYOND HIGH SCHOOL. THERE HAS BEEN A SIGNIFICANT INVESTMENT IN CLINTON AND JACKSON COUNTIES!


