FELLOW ROTARIAN CARRIE DONAIRE SPOKE TO OUR CLUB ON MONDAY TO DISCUSS ONE OF OUR INTERNATIONAL PROJECTS -- PROVIDING GREENHOUSES IN OAXACA, MEXICO (OAXACA IS PRONOUNCED "WA-HA-KA"). THE ROTARY CLUB OF CLINTON PARTNERED WITH THE ROTARY CLUB OF THE UNIVERSITY DISTRICT OF SEATTLE AND WE ASSIST THROUGH FINANCIAL CONTRIBUTIONS (WE'VE DONATED \$1950. EACH GREENHOUSE COSTS \$325 WE'VE FUNDED 6 GREENHOUSES.). THESE GREENHOUSES PROVIDE FOOD AND CAN ALMOST DOUBLE THEIR ANNUAL INCOME (.65/DAY + \$75-100/MO). THEY GROW TOMATOES, PAPALO, STRING BEANS, SQUASH, CACTUS, CHILIES, ONIONS, GREEN BEANS, RADISHES, CILANTRO, AND MORE!

THE RESULTS OF THESE GREENHOUSES? SAVING MONEY ON NUTRITIOUS, HEALTHY FOOD, SAVING MONEY ON TRANSPORTATION TO MARKET (1-2 HOURS BY BUS), SHARING EXCESS FOOD WITH NEIGHBORS, BARTERING OR SELLING, AND IMPROVED QUALITY OF LIFE. THE PEOPLE OF OAXACA ALSO INVOLVE CHILDREN IN THE FAMILY WORK, CREATING MORE OPPORTUNITIES FOR MORE KNOWLEDGE TO BE SHARED.

FOUNDATION MINUTE

WELCOME TO WEEK ONE OF ROTARY INTERNATIONAL'S MONTH OF DISEASE PREVENTION & TREATMENT.

THE MONTH HAS NO SOONER BEGUN THAN DECEMBER'S ROTARY THEME OF "DISEASE PREVENTION AND TREATMENT" STARTED MANIFESTING ITSELF. ACCORDING TO A REPORT BY DICK DOLINSKI OF THE ROTARY CLUB OF MIDLAND (MI), TRF RECENTLY APPROVED A GLOBAL GRANT OF \$83,800 TO SUPPORT SANITATION, SOLAR POWER, AND TEACHING/LEARNING TECHNOLOGY PROJECTS FOR TWO SCHOOLS IN RURAL UGANDA. ROTARY'S CURRENT THEME OF "SERVE TO CHANGE LIVES" CERTAINLY CAPTURES THE COLLABORATION BETWEEN THE PARTICIPATING ROTARY CLUBS AND DISTRICTS ACROSS TWO CONTINENTS AND ROTARY INTERNATIONAL.

THE ROTARY CLUBS OF: KABALE, UGANDA; PETALUMA, CALIFORNIA; TRAVERSE CITY AND MIDLAND NOON, MICHIGAN, ALONG WITH THEIR RESPECTIVE ROTARY DISTRICTS. COLLABORATED WITH TRF TO FUND THIS \$83,000 GLOBAL GRANT. THE RECIPIENTS OF THE GRANT ARE: MUKO HIGH SCHOOL (MHS), A PREDOMINANTLY FOCUSED BOARDING SCHOOL EDUCATING ABOUT 250 STUDENTS IN SOUTHWESTERN UGANDA AND DIVINE MERCY ELEMENTARY SCHOOL (DMS) WITH APPROXIMATELY 200 STUDENTS IN GRADES K-6 LOCATED ABOUT 20 MILES NORTH OF MUKO.

THIS GLOBAL GRANT PROMISES TO PROVIDE IMPORTANT INFRASTRUCTURE THAT WILL RESULT IN MULTIPLE BENEFITS TO THE STUDENTS AT BOTH MHS AND DMS AS WELL AS FOR THEIR TEACHERS, PARENTS, AND OTHERS LIVING IN THE AREA. THE GRANT, THAT INCLUDES THE AFOREMENTIONED SERVICES, WILL PROVIDE THE STUDENTS, STAFF AND VILLAGERS A MARVELOUS OPPORTUNITY TO FLOURISH AND THRIVE. IT ALSO PROMISES TO DRAMATICALLY IMPROVE THE QUALITY OF LIFE FOR THE PEOPLE IN THE AREA. IT WILL INDEED BE "BENEFICIAL TO ALL **CONCERNED!**"
