

MEETING MINUTES



This past Monday, we welcomed the new site manager at LyondellBasell Clinton Complex, Yarelis (Yari) Hernandez to our meeting. Yari received her Chemical Engineering degree from Penn State and started her work career in Texas. She has been with LyondellBasell for the last 22 years. She has been with LyondellBasell for the last 22 years. In addition to various engineering assignments, she served as Regional Director for Health, Safety and Environmental in North America and most recently as site manager of the Chocolate Bayou, Texas. Safety is a huge priority for LyondellBasell. As a company, they had plateaued at .22-.21 TRIR injury rate. After rolling out the type of programs that Yari was instrumental in implementing, which was focused around first line shift supervisors, it dropped to TRIR .18. North America reached a record low of TRIR .12 -- the lowest TRIR in company history.

LyondellBasell has already starting the year off right – in addition to giving nearly \$200,000 to United Way of Clinton County, Iowa just a few weeks ago, on Jan 27, LyondellBasell was listed as "World's Most Admired Companies" for the third consecutive year. LyondellBasell is ranked 5th and is viewed as having one the strongest reputations across a variety of industry sectors.

In 2019, LyondellBasell Clinton Complex:

- The estimated amount that goes into our economy from LyondellBasell is \$180 million dollars.
- Successfully completed a turnaround safely, providing an economic boost of \$26.8 million to Clinton and the surrounding area; 500 local contractors, \$12.5 million dollars in local labor.
- LyondellBasell received the DSA (Distinguished Safety Award), a top honor from the American Fuel and Petrochemical Manufacturers (June, 2019)
- One of the largest chemical plants in Iowa and operate on nearly 250,000 acres
- The Clinton Complex has over 325 employees, roughly 100 contractors.
- 4.6 million hours of working safely at this site

LyondellBasell, as a company:

- Played a leadership role in creating and launching the first global, cross-value chain Alliance to End Plastic Waste
- Collaborated with Samsonite to create a suitcase collection made of 100 percent post-consumer plastic waste provided through our Quality Circular Polymers joint venture with SUEZ;
- Announced Memoranda of Understanding to form two joint ventures in China which will produce chemicals used in a variety of applications including construction materials, packaging and furnishings

Yari provided some advice to young folks who are just starting to look into the horizon, but it can really be applied to all of us: "Set yourself very high goals. Work for them. And don't be afraid to make changes."

FOUNDATION MINUTE

The Eradication of Polio is one of the goals of TRF, and through its Polio-Plus program's partnership with the Bill and Melinda Gates Foundation, it has almost obliterated the disease from the face of the planet. On January 22, 2020, Rotary International and The Bill & Melinda Gates Foundation announced a renewal of their longstanding joint commitment to end polio. Based on a partnership forged over a decade ago, Rotary is committed to raising \$50 million every year, over the next three years, to be matched with two additional dollars from the Gates Foundation. This expanded agreement adds up to \$450 million for Polio Eradication activities. In a video message to Rotary volunteers, Gates admitted that his foundation's partnership with Rotary "... has been vital to fighting polio." So far, Rotary has contributed more than \$2billion on polio eradication, with matching funds from the Gates Foundation.

In another generous gesture, the Gates Foundation is donating \$2 for each \$1 pledged for the planned Fight to End Polio Flight. Iowa natives and members of the International Fellowship of Flying Rotarians, John Ockenfels of Iowa City and Peter Teahen of Ceda Rapids, plan to raise awareness for polio eradication by piloting a single-engine aircraft around the globe. Along their route, they also hope to raise much-needed funds to aid in the complete elimination of the paralytic disease. The 20,000 mile-long- flight which will last 51 days, will take off from Cedar Rapids on March 24. (Stay tuned for updates on this unique event!)

Good news from Mysore in the Indian state of Karnataka. There, at the recently concluded Rotary District 3189 Conference, a business executive, Bastian Joseph donated the sum of 36 Lakh Rupees (\$50,472 US) to Rotary Foundation. The donation is to be spent on community-based projects pioneered by Rotary. A reminder to start thinking of ideas for Peace and Conflict Resolution.
