

SOME OF THESE CONCEPTS INCLUDE LEARNING SAFE MEDICATION PRACTICES (ONLY USING PRESCRIPTION MEDICATIONS AS DIRECTED BY A HEALTH CARE PROFESSIONAL, NOT SHARING OR TAKING SOMEONE ELSE'S MEDICATION, AND KEEPING OUR MEDICATIONS IN A SAFE LOCATION) AND KNOWLEDGE ON WHAT DRUG MISUSE IS. DRUG MISUSE IS OUR COUNTRY'S LEADING CAUSE OF ACCIDENTAL DEATH. MOST PEOPLE WHO USE HEROIN OR OTHER ILLICIT DRUGS, WILL OFTEN START BY MISUSING PRESCRIPTION DRUGS.


