

Meeting HERE Next Era Energy

Tim Arnold and Kimberly Dickey joined us on Monday, both from Next Era Energy, to talk about the Clinton County Wind Project and the Rock Creek Solar Project.

Tim Arnold is a Senior Project Developer at NextEra Energy Resources and has been working in the renewable energy field for over 15 years. Arnold stated, "One of the things that I really, really love about them (the company) is the values we hold to be important...committed to Excellence, we do the right thing, we treat people with respect, so that's kind of at the forefront of everything that we try and do with all of our projects across the 41 states that we're currently developing in." They started work in Iowa in 1999 and now have 12 operating wind projects in the state, investing around \$3.1 billion in communities across the state.

Kimberly Dickey is a project director for NextEra Energy Resources and manages the development of projects from start to finish. The Rock Creek Solar project is an innovative solar project proposed for the cities of Clinton and Camanche, and Clinton County, Iowa that will have a capacity of up to 150 megawatts of clean, renewable, American-made solar energy. The Rock Creek Solar project is more than solar panels - it represents a significant capital investment in Iowa. Once operational, it will create good-paying jobs and millions in additional revenue for the local community. So, why Clinton, Iowa? Dickey stated, "This is a great super highway for overhead transmission." Solar projects are successful when landowner interest and community support align.

Presidential Project Food Security Summit - March 2025

Goals:

- Local Initiative:
 - Host a strategic planning session for Clinton, Iowa's social agencies to address food security with county-wide participation.
 - Engage a professional facilitator to create a plan for sustainable solutions.
 - Rotary Club of Clinton acts as a catalyst for collaboration and resource sharing, funded by the Rotary Foundation.
- Awareness Campaign:
 - Produce videos showcasing Rotary's role as a convener and problem solver.
 - Highlight the club's efforts to address food insecurity and share results to inspire community support.
 - Participating agencies will have access to these materials to help support their missions.

Key Elements

- Global Impact: Since 2019, Rotary Club of Clinton has supported sustainable gardening and water management in Oaxaca, connecting clubs internationally to tackle humanitarian issues.
- Local Collaboration: The club will unify Clinton's social agencies to address food insecurity and amplify local efforts through collaboration.
- **Storytelling:** Professionally produced videos will promote awareness of Rotary's global and local impact, fostering support for initiatives.

Club President Carrie Donaire draws on her Peace Corps experience in food security and agriculture in Nicaragua to inform her vision, emphasizing both global and local solutions.
