



Rotary District 6000 Proclamation of January as Slavery and Human Trafficking Prevention Month

Whereas, the United States was founded upon the principle that all people are created with the inalienable right to freedom, and added the 13th Amendment to the Constitution making slavery illegal; and

Whereas, slavery within the United States today is most often found in the form of forced labor and sex trafficking, which weakens our social fabric, increases violence and organized crime, and debases our humanity; and

Whereas, this heinous crime is expanding globally as well as within the state of lowa; and

Whereas, even though awareness of this crime is growing, human trafficking continues to go unreported due to its hidden nature, and the lack of awareness about its indicators; and

Whereas, every Rotary Club and individual Rotarian can make a difference by choosing products that are not produced by forced labor; by working to protect our young people from exploitation; by addressing the problem of internet sex trafficking; and by becoming more aware of the problem and how Rotarians can help to prevent human trafficking, and

Whereas, the Rotary District 6000 Prevent Human Trafficking Action Team is preparing to launch a 2022 Action Team Pilot Prevention Project to increase awareness and prevention, and if successful to expand the Pilot Project in 2023 and write/encourage all District 6000 clubs to initiate anti-trafficking prevention projects

Now, Therefore, In addition to Rotary International's theme for January which is dedicated to vocational service, the Board of Directors of Rotary District 6000 hereby proclaims the month of January 2022 as Slavery and Human Trafficking Prevention Month and encourages all Rotarians to become more informed on this growing problem, to be vigilant and report suspicious activity, and to support projects to prevent trafficking in all its forms within lowa. We further request all District 6000 Clubs to share this proclamation during a January 2022 club meeting.
