FOUNDATION MINUTE

Welcome to Week 3 of Rotary International's Vocational Service Month.

Personal hygiene and environmental sanitation are enhanced when community members have easy access to portable, clean water. These pandemic days heighten the importance of easy access to clean water. Public health is jeopardized when the people have no hygienic toilets and bathrooms for personal use. As part of Rotary International's focus on Water, Sanitation and Hygiene, TRF is tasked with supporting activities that encourage the management of freshwater resources and providing universal and equitable access to safe drinking water, sanitation and hygiene. TRF seeks to empower governments, institutions, and communities to manage their water, sanitation and hygiene services through environmentally sound, measurable, and sustainable interventions.

One of the ways TRF achieves this aim is by facilitating universal and equitable access to improved sanitation and waste management services in order to achieve open defecation-free communities through it Global Grant initiatives. Two Global Grants were recently approved by TRF for the purchase of materials and supplies needed for sustainable clean water, sanitation and hygiene facilities in the Mayan villages of Agui Caliente and Paxorotot in Guatemala. District 7890 (Northampton, MA) has previously sponsored 25 projects in Guatemala. The district worked with the host club, The Rotary Club of La Antigua to use \$237,817 USD to acquire the material for the projects. A total of 4,208 people, comprising of 668 families will benefit from the improvements to their drinking water and general hygiene and sanitation.

The District Chair for Water & Sanitation Projects and member of the Rotary Club of Manchester, MA, Rick Lawrence will share with any club how these projects impact the lives of the people involved. He is also willing to present virtually or in-person when convenient. - Pakistan No new Wild Polio cases reported this week. Eighty-four Polio cases reported in 2020. The most recent case had an onset of paralysis on 11/14/20. Pakistan reported 147 Wild Polio cases in 2019. Six Polio-Positive Environmental Samples were reported this week in Pakistan.
- Afghanistan No new Wild Polio cases reported this past week. Fifty-six Polio cases reported in 2020 The
 most recent case had an onset of paralysis on 10/02/20. Afghanistan reported twenty-nine Wild Polio
 cases in 2019. No Polio-Positive Environmental Samples were reported this week in Afghanistan.
