FOUNDATION MINUTE

WELCOME TO THE LAST WEEK OF JUNE, THE FELLOWSHIP MONTH OF ROTARY INTERNATIONAL.

NEWS FROM ITALY REPORTS THAT SIXTEEN ROTARY CLUBS FROM ROMAGNA (NORTHERN ITALY) HAVE RESPONDED TO THE NEEDS OF THE ROMAGNA HEALTHCARE SYSTEM. JOINING FORCES. THEY PARTICIPATED IN A GLOBAL GRANT FUNDED BY THE ROTARY FOUNDATION. THE 78,000 EURO GRANT (\$93.092 USD) MADE IT POSSIBLE FOR THE CLUBS TO LAUNCH A TELEMEDICINE PROJECT FOR THE ASSISTANCE AND HOME MONITORING OF PATIENTS THAT HAVE HAD CARDIAC DEVICES (PACEMAKERS, DEFIBRILLATORS AND **RESYNCHRONIZERS) IMPLANTED. "REMOTEHEART" IS A** PROJECT BASED ON THE REMOTE CONTROL OF THE LATEST GENERATION OF IMPLANTABLE CARDIAC DEVICES. WHICH ALLOWS COMMUNICATION WITH A TRANSMITTER IN THE PATIENT'S HOME THAT THEN SENDS TECHNICAL DATA. PARAMETERS AND CLINICAL INFORMATION TO THE PATIENT'S DOCTOR. THANKS TO THE ROMAGNA ROTARY CLUBS, THIS PROJECT WILL NOW BE EXTENDED TO THE WHOLE OF USL ROMAGNA.

NO NEW WILD POLIO CASES REPORTED THIS WEEK! THE FIRST OF THE COMPREHENSIVE LIST OF ACTIONS ON THE DELIVERING ON A PROMISE - POLIO ERADICATION STRATEGY 2022-2026 IS: FURTHER INTEGRATING POLIO ACTIVITIES WITH ESSENTIAL HEALTH SERVICES - INCLUDING ROUTINE IMMUNIZATIONS - AND BUILDING CLOSER PARTNERSHIPS WITH HIGH-RISK COMMUNITIES TO CO-DESIGN IMMUNIZATION EVENTS AND BETTER MEET THEIR HEALTH NEEDS, PARTICULARLY IN PAKISTAN AND AFGHANISTAN.

ONE WPV1 & CVDPV2 POSITIVE ENVIRONMENTAL SAMPLE WAS REPORTED THIS WEEK IN PAKISTAN. AFGHANISTAN NO NEW WILD POLIO CASES REPORTED THIS WEEK. ONE WILD POLIO CASE REPORTED IN 2021 THE MOST RECENT CASE HAD AN ONSET OF PARALYSIS ON 1/01/21. AFGHANISTAN REPORTED 56 WILD POLIO CASES IN 2020. NO WPV1 & CVDPV2-POSITIVE ENVIRONMENTAL SAMPLES WERE REPORTED THIS WEEK IN AFGHANISTAN.
