E Iowa Libraries at a Crossroads: Navigating Legislative Change and Advocating for Access

In his recent presentation to Rotarians, Eric Jennings, President of the Iowa Library Association (ILA), outlined the challenges and ongoing resilience of Iowa libraries amidst a shifting legislative landscape. With nearly 30 years of experience, Jennings emphasized ILA's mission of empowering library staff, advocating for libraries as community resources, and ensuring equitable access to information.

Key Challenges Facing Iowa Libraries:

- 1. Politicization and Censorship:
 - o Iowa ranks second in the U.S. for anti-library bills. Senate File 496 was particularly impactful, aiming to remove books with sexual content, leading to confusion and nearly 3,400 book removals from school districts. This bill's vague definitions created significant challenges for libraries, including the removal of classic works like 1984 and To Kill a Mockingbird.
- 2. Threats to Professional Standards:
 - House File 880 and Senate File 391 questioned the autonomy and expertise of librarians. HF880 proposed cutting funding to libraries that are affiliated with national organizations like the American Library Association (ALA), which could harm professional development and programming. SF391 eliminated the requirement for school librarians to be specially licensed, jeopardizing the quality of student library services.
- 3. Funding and Governance Pressures:
 - A 2023 tax law rewrite (HF718) jeopardized library funding by invalidating locally approved levies in 97 Iowa communities. This could lead to cuts in hours, staff, and programming.
- 4. Federal Support at Risk:
 - An executive order targeting the IMLS could further threaten vital resources like interlibrary loan systems, summer reading programs, and continuing education, especially for smaller libraries.

Call to Action: What Can You Do?

Jennings encouraged the community to:

- Support local libraries by engaging with librarians about their needs.
- Contact legislators to advocate for library funding and autonomy, sharing personal stories.
- Join or donate to ILA to strengthen advocacy efforts.
- Raise awareness of Iowa's history of intellectual freedom, including the creation of the Library Bill of Rights in Des Moines in the 1930s.

Jennings closed by emphasizing that libraries, despite the challenges, continue to be "places of possibility"—key equalizers, knowledge centers, and community builders—but they need public support to thrive.
