**Dear Polio Eradication Warriors,** 

#### Nine new Wild Polio cases reported this week.

What is that Polio Picture? Think it's easy to reach every child in Afghanistan? Well it's not! More than 65,000 people across the country are volunteering and working towards this goal, such as these supervisors who are transporting polio vaccines for a vaccination campaign to the remote districts and villages of Kunar province.

The Rotary Foundation recently received their twelfth consecutive, highest possible, Four Star rating from Charity Navigator!

**Did You Know -** Twenty-five countries plan to retain Type 2 Poliovirus in 76 designated Poliovirus-essential facilities for the production of vaccine, research, and diagnostics.

Minister Gould committed C\$ 47.5 million annually over four years to support the Global Polio Eradication Initiative's Endgame Strategy, and renewed funding for Gavi, the Vaccine Alliance, ahead of its upcoming replenishment.

#### The Final Three Polio Endemic Countries:

**Pakistan** - Two new Polio case reported this week. Fifty-five Polio cases reported in 2020. The most recent case were from two Provinces with an onset of paralysis on 06/04/20. Pakistan reported 147 Wild Polio cases in 2019. Ten Polio-Positive Environmental Samples were reported this week in Pakistan.

**Afghanistan** - Seven new Polio cases reported this past week. Twenty-six Polio cases reported in 2020. The most recent cases were from five Provinces with an onset of paralysis on 6/03/20. Afghanistan reported twenty-nine Wild Polio cases in 2019. No Polio-Positive Environmental Samples were reported this week in Afghanistan.

**Nigeria** - No Wild Polio cases have been reported in 2017, 2018, or 2019. The most recent Polio case was reported on 8/20/16. Nigeria is to be congratulated on over Three Years without a Wild Polio case!
