Check It But!

THE ROTARY CLUB OF CLINTON HAS BENEFITED FROM NUMEROUS DISTRICT 6000 COMMUNITY SERVICE GRANTS FUNDED THROUGH THE ROTARY INTERNATIONAL FOUNDATION. THESE GRANTS HAVE HELPED THE CLUB COMPLETE VARIOUS LOCAL PROJECTS SUCH AS JOSH THE OTTER, THE BACKPACK LITERACY PROJECT, AND MORE.

RECENTLY THE DISTRICT WAS APPROVED FOR A \$25,000 EMERGENCY DISASTER GRANT TO ASSIST WITH INTERIM HOUSING FOR A COMMUNITY IN UKRAINE THAT HAS HAD 85% OF THE LOCAL RESIDENCES DESTROYED RESULTING IN THOSE FAMILIES HAVING NO ACCESS TO A RESTROOM, WATER, A PLACE TO SLEEP OR EAT. THE HOUSING PROJECT WILL PROVIDE 300 HOMES TO LOCAL RESIDENTS OVER THE NEXT THREE MONTHS. THIS WILL BE A SUSTAINABLE PROJECT AS PLANS ARE IN PLACE THAT IF AND WHEN THE FAMILIES CAN CONSTRUCT PERMANENT HOUSING, THESE HOUSES WILL BE UTILIZED IN OTHER SOCIAL HOUSING NEEDS THROUGHOUT UKRAINE.

THIS PAST MONDAY, FELLOW ROTARIAN BRENT ALBRECHTSEN PRESENTED TO OUR CLUB ABOUT THE WALK FOR ALZHEIMER'S. THE WALK FOR ALZHEIMER'S CAME TO CLINTON THREE YEARS AGO, JUST DAYS BEFORE THE DERECHO HIT. HISTORICALLY, THE WALK HAS BEEN HELD IN THE QUAD CITIES, BUT DUE TO THE ABUNDANCE OF PEOPLE AFFECTED BY THE DISEASE, ALBRECHTSEN FELT IT WAS IMPORTANT FOR REPRESENTATION IN CLINTON. LAST YEAR, THEY RAISED \$27,000 OUT OF CLINTON COUNTY, WHICH WAS "HEAD AND SHOULDERS ABOVE THE YEARS PRIOR."


ALBRECHTSEN STATED THAT THE SINGLE BEST WAY TO "KEEP SCORE" WHEN IT COMES TO THE ALZHEIMER'S WALK WAS THROUGH THE NUMBER OF PEOPLE THAT PARTICIPATE IN THE WALK. FOUNDATION MINUTE

WELCOME TO WEEK 2 OF ROTARY INTERNATIONAL'S MONTH OF TRANSITION.

WHEN THE NEW ROTARY YEAR BEGAN ON JULY 1 OF THIS YEAR, NEW PRESIDENTS ENCOURAGED MEMBERS TO ACTIVELY PARTICIPATE IN COMMITTEES AND PROJECTS. SEVERAL CLUBS ARE CONTINUING WITH ONGOING PROJECTS, WHILE OTHERS ARE PICKING UP NEW ONES. ONE SUCH CLUB, THE ROTARY CLUB OF ST VINCENT SOUTH (D7030), PLANS TO ENSURE THE SUCCESSFUL DELIVERY OF THE BREAST CANCER AWARENESS GLOBAL GRANT. ACCORDING TO AN ONLINE REPORT. THE PROJECT WILL IMPROVE ACCESS TO BREAST CANCER SCREENING SERVICES AND BREAST HEALTH AWARENESS TO WOMEN AND GIRLS IN RURAL COMMUNITIES OF ST. VINCENT AND THE GRENADINES THROUGH THE PROCUREMENT OF MOBILE ULTRASOUND MACHINES. THE NEW PRESIDENT, ENGINEER DANIEL CAMPBELL ALSO INTENDS TO PRIORITIZE THE IMPLEMENTATION OF PROJECTS TO TACKLE THE CRITICAL ISSUE OF PROSTATE CANCER WHICH ACCOUNTS FOR 18%-47% OF CANCER DEATHS IN ST. VINCENT GRENADIERS (SVG). SUBMITTED BY THE ROTARY CLUB OF ST. VINCENT AND THE ROTARY CLUB OF TAIPEI PROSPERITY, THE GRANT HAS BEEN APPROVED BY THE ROTARY FOUNDATION IN THE AMOUNT OF US\$180,180. "IT'S GREAT TO IMAGINE, AND IT IS EVEN BETTER TO DO! ROTARIANS ARE PEOPLE OF ACTION AND WILL BE COMMITTED TO BOTH IMAGINING NEW POSSIBILITIES AND WORKING TOGETHER TO IMPROVE OUR COMMUNITIES," CAMPBELL SAID.
