



# THE WEEKLY ROUND-UP



We had our first-ever hybrid meeting on Monday, with quite a number of guests, from Seattle, Washington, Mexico City; Huajuapan de León, Oaxaca; and Tehuacán, Puebla! Our speaker was Susan Sola, a member of the Rotary Club of the University

District, in Seattle, Washington. Susan spoke about the joint project of four clubs (Rotary Club of the University District, Seattle, Washington, Club Rotario Plateros Centro Historico, Club Rotario Bellavista Atizapan, and of course, our Club, the Rotary Club of Clinton) to help impoverished areas in Huajuapan De Leon, Oaxaca (Mexico). The project is lovingly referred to as the Mexican Rural Family Greenhouse Project. Our clubs have partnered together for one main objective: To increase the availability of healthy, nutritious food through the construction of greenhouses (macrotúneles) for mothers in the Mixtec region of the state of Oaxaca, though, this has a lifechanging effect for the entire family. The benefits that have been seen: 147 Greenhouses constructed to date, 137 Families directly benefited, 1,365 People indirectly benefitted (family members), 9 Educational institutions directly benefiitted, 662 Indirect school beneficieries (students).

In December 2019, our club donated enough money to fund six greenhouses and we have a club goal for continued support for this initiative.



#### FOUNDATION MINUTE

#### Welcome to Week 3 of Rotary International's Month of Transition!

Two weeks ago, The Foundation Minute reported on the \$50,000 Global Grant Scholarship that was awarded to Kate Hart to pursue a master's degree in Israel. Well, TRF has awarded Alisha Ault with a \$40,00 Rotary Foundation Global Grant Scholarship, to pursue a master's degree in Development Studies at the Institute of Development Studies, University of Sussex, England. The 2015 alumna of the University of Virginia (UVA) is multi-lingual, fluent in Spanish, Portuguese and English, has lived and worked among the poor in Guatemala, Brazil and Equatorial Guinea. The talented awardee majored in foreign affairs, Spanish literature and culture, with a minor in Latin American Studies.

The Rotary Foundation Global Grant funds graduate-level coursework or research in one of The Rotary Foundation's 7 areas of focus, for up to four academic years. In consonance with TRF's emphasis on supporting education and alleviating poverty, Ms. Ault will study for an advance degree that will allow her to contribute to the reduction of poverty and improvement of quality of life of those less fortunate than herself, particularly in developing countries like those she had lived and grown up in. She states, "I have known that I wanted to work in international development since I was an undergraduate at UVA."

Impressed by the significant award given to Ms. Ault, the assistant dean of global affairs at UVA's McIntire School of Commerce said that the awarding of this scholarship "gives us a chance each year to meet some of the brightest UVA students, who also share Rotary's interest in positively impacting our world.... We welcome the chance to feature such outstanding students pursuing graduate programs outside of the United States, especially at this moment when international and intercultural education are so critical to the advancement of civil society."
