Jenna Stevens and several students joined us on Monday. Stevens is the Classroom Consultant for AG for Clinton and Jackson Counties. "Ag in the Classroom" is a program sponsored by the <u>Clinton County Farm Bureau</u> with the goal of making sure students know where their food comes from and who is doing the hard work to produce that food.

Stevens stated "About eight years ago, I started this media marketing program when I was still teaching at Northeast. I was a teacher at Northeast and transitioned into the role that I'm in today and I was fortunate enough to bring this program with me. The program started out at a radio show um at KCLN and my students did a Friday morning segment and that transitioned later on into a television show. They did a TV show called AgraVision that we produced for a year during COVID." Stevens explained that through this, they've had the opportunity to travel and to do a lot of Agricultural Marketing and media projects. The students are currently working with the Livestock and Rodeo Industry. Past and present students "have had an opportunity to travel and do um programming. They have helped to put on um a beef reproductive conference at the University of Tennessee. We've worked with the University of Colorado several different times on some of their International livestock programming. We have been to Iowa State and done a lot of different programming out there." Stevens mentioned one highlight is working with the National Finals Rodeo, which has led them to go to Las Vegas for several years.

Stevens' students came to the meeting and told our club about their experiences in Las Vegas and what they're working on, including writing a Children's Book, creating workshops for presentational development and career skills, and more.
