On Monday, we had the sweetest guest present to us. Mary Ann Sheppard, owner of Grandma's Goody Jar, joined us and talked about her journey into Clinton and her small business. Sheppard, a native New Yorker, moved to Clinton over ten years ago. When her mother passed away, she was given an inheritance and decided to pursue her dream of owning a candy shop.

At Grandma's Goody Jar, you'll find handmade truffles and handmade candies. "I have vintage things -- things you haven't seen in 100 years or things like gummy bears. Everybody's used to getting the ones that have a texture like erasers. Mine just melt in your mouth!" Sheppard also makes cow chips, which are chocolate-covered potato chips that are half dipped in peanut butter chocolate, chocolate-covered cheese puffs, and she's the Original Home of the Midwestern Sponge Candy. Sheppard had to discontinue her popular "Candy From the Decade" boxes since COVID, due to a huge increase in prices for the candies. Sheppard stated that she tries to be as community conscious as possible and couldn't justify them in her shop, with the huge price hike.

Sheppard has had a lot of success throughout the community of Clinton. She has been hired to cater desserts for a variety of groups and businesses within Clinton, including one that she made a Pretzel, Peanuts, Potato Chips and Milk Chocolate Mix for, which is now commonly referred to as "Crack" because once you start eating it, you can't stop! She has also had large orders through the Sisters of St Francis, Central Bank, who used Grandma's Goody Jar for their Christmas gifts to their employees for the last two years, Clinton National and United Way, who purchased Carmel Apples from Sheppard. In 2022, Grandma's Goody Jar was voted the Number One Gift Shop in Clinton!



FOUNDATION MINUTE

IT'S WEEK 2 OF RI'S MONTH OF ROTARY FELLOWSHIPS

WELCOME BACK HOME TO ALL ROTARIANS WHO ATTENDED THE INTERNATIONAL CONVENTION IN MELBOURNE, AUSTRALIA. WHILE THE MAIN EVENT OF THE YEAR WAS HAPPENING DOWN UNDER, ROTARY CLUBS IN OTHER PARTS OF THE GLOBE WERE BUSY ADVANCING WORLD UNDERSTANDING BY PROVIDING QUALITY EDUCATION, ONE OF THE PRIMARY MISSION GOALS OF TRF.

THIS WEEK'S FM IS ON THREE ROTARY CLUBS THAT HAVE PROVIDED SCHOLARSHIPS TO NEEDY STUDENTS. THE VANCOUVER ROTARY FOUNDATION AWARDED \$120,000 IN COLLEGE SCHOLARSHIPS RANGING IN VALUE FROM \$2,000 TO \$4,000 TO 32 SOUTHWEST WASHINGTON HIGH SCHOOL AND COLLEGE STUDENTS. IN 50 YEARS, THE FOUNDATION, WHICH IS THE CHARITABLE ARM OF THE ROTARY CLUB OF VANCOUVER, HAS AWARDED MORE THAN \$2 MILLION IN SCHOLARSHIPS TO LOCAL STUDENTS. IN ANOTHER REPORT, THE FOUNDATION OF THE CASA GRANDE ROTARY CLUB (AZ) HAS AWARDED \$80,500 TO STUDENTS AND THREE NONPROFIT ORGANIZATIONS. ON TUESDAY, JUNE 6, 2023, DURING A CLUB MEETING AT EVA'S FINE MEXICAN FOOD, THE FOUNDATION AWARDED \$11,500 EACH TO BOYS & GIRLS CLUBS OF THE SUN CORRIDOR, PINAL COUNCIL FOR CASA/FOSTER INC. AND THE AARP READING LITERACY PROGRAM. THE FOUNDATION ALSO RECENTLY AWARDED COLLEGE SCHOLARSHIPS TOTALING \$46,000 TO SENIORS AT CASA GRANDE HIGH SCHOOLS. OVER THE YEARS, THE CLUB HAS AWARDED MORE THAN \$1.5 MILLION IN SCHOLARSHIPS AND BEEN A LONGTIME CONTRIBUTOR TO THE BOYS & GIRLS CLUBS AND OTHER NONPROFITS.

ON FRIDAY JUNE 10, DR. MICHAEL HART OF ROTARY CLUB OF WESTFIELD (NJ) REPORTS THAT HIS CLUB HAS AWARDED \$94,450 IN SCHOLARSHIPS TO 16 STUDENTS. SINCE 1967 THE ROTARY CLUB OF WESTFIELD HAS AWARDED OVER \$3.4 MILLION DOLLARS IN SCHOLARSHIPS TO APPROXIMATELY 1,800 STUDENTS.
