THE WEEKLY ROUND-UP



We had the absolute privilege of welcoming Clinton County Auditor, Eric Van Lancker to our meeting this past Monday, who discussed the recent elections and how Clinton County reacted to voting in a pandemic and the success of absentee voting.

The time to vote absentee was moved back from 29 days to 40 days, which drastically helped voters. In mid-March, Clinton County decided to reduce the number of polling locations from 26 to 5 open polling locations. There were additional safety precautions in place, with shields, disinfectants, and a pencil to keep from the time you got to the poll through the time you finished.

Quite a large amount of people voted absentee, perhaps for the first time ever. Van Lancker stated, "... we had the best turn out of any primary ever in Clinton County, but we also had the biggest turn out for any primary in the state of Iowa as well. In Clinton County we had a 23.5% turnout. Our previous high was not even 15% so that was a that was an incredible turn out there. We also had a over a 90% return rate on the absentee ballots that we sent out...a total of 8000 votes and then just over 6500 (82%) of those where absentee ballot."

Though this hasn't be proven, some absentee voters say the political calls stop after turning in their ballot. Van Lancker gave some tips for absentee ballot voting – be sure to fill out the entire form, including Date of Birth, Phone number, your ID number (drivers license number or a non operator ID issued by the state), pick the election type (which election this ballot is for) and "at the very bottom always please sign and date. We always get a lot of them that it turned in without signature and we absolutely can't do anything any further without getting that signature on there." Also don't forget to sign the outside of the envelope! FOUNDATION MINUTE

Welcome to Week 4 of Rotary's Month of Youth Activities!

Sometime in March, the Africa Regional Certification Commission (ARCC) concluded its final field visit to Nigeria to determine the country's polio-free status. The news buzzing around the Rotary world is that Polio is no longer endemic in Nigeria and that the most populous nation in Africa is certified Polio-Free by the World Health Organization. Nigeria has not had a case of wild poliovirus since July 24, 2014. All laboratory data has confirmed that a full 12 months has passed without any new cases.

Rotary International has contributed, through TRF about \$268 million to fight Polio in Nigeria; so, this is a victory worth celebrating. The chair of Rotary's Nigeria National PolioPlus Committee, Dr. Tunji Funsho, while acknowledging the milestone, cautions Rotarians about celebrating too soon. "It's paramount that we ensure all doors are locked to the re-entry of the wild poliovirus into our country." As recently as 2012, Nigeria accounted for more than half of all polio cases worldwide. However, according to WHO, no less than 200,000 volunteers across the country repeatedly immunized more than 45 million children under the age of 5, to ensure that no child would suffer from this paralyzing disease. Commenting on this huge accomplishment, WHO's Director-General, Dr. Margaret Chan said "we must now support the efforts in Pakistan and Afghanistan so they soon join the polio-free world."

Since 1988, polio incidence has been reduced by more than 99 percent. Before then, the virus was paralyzing an average of 350,000 children every year in more than 125 countries.

As we begin a new Rotary year, let us continue to support all efforts at eradicating Polio from the face of the planet.

Dear Polio Eradication Warriors, Five new Wild Polio case reported this week.

What is that Polio News? Nigeria (and All of Africa) Now Certain To Be Certified Polio-Free! Yesterday, Nigeria's **Complete Documentation for a Polio free Country has been** accepted by the African Regional Certification Committee (ARCC) of WHO. A hearty Congratulations to everyone who worked so hard to get us to this point. We now await the formal certification by WHO in late August.Please Support the Polio Eradication Effort by June 30!

The Final Three Polio Endemic Countries: Pakistan - One new Polio case reported this week. Fifty-one Polio cases reported in 2020. The most recent case was from the Balochistan Province with an onset of paralysis on 05/16/20.

- Pakistan reported 147 Wild Polio cases in 2019. Eighteen Polio-Positive Environmental Samples were reported this week in Pakistan.
- Afghanistan Four new Polio cases reported this past week. Sixteen Polio cases reported in 2020. The most recent cases • were from the Farah, Hirat, and Hilmand Provinces with an onset of paralysis on 5/10/20. Afghanistan reported twenty-nine Wild Polio cases in 2019. Five Polio-Positive Environmental Samples were reported this week in Afghanistan.
- Nigeria No Wild Polio cases have been reported in 2017, 2018, or 2019. The most recent Polio case was reported on 8/20/16. Nigeria is to be congratulated on over Three Years without a Wild Polio case!
