FOUNDATION MINUTE

WELCOME TO WEEK 4 OF RI'S MONTH OF PEACE AND CONFLICT PREVENTION/RESOLUTION.

PROMOTING PEACE IS ONE OF THE ROTARY FOUNDATION'S 7 AREAS OF FOCUS. AS THE MONTH OF PEACE AND CONFLICT RESOLUTION DRAWS TO A CLOSE, THE FOUNDATION MINUTE WILL FOCUS THIS WEEK'S ATTENTION ON TRF FUNDED PEACE CENTERS.

ACCORDING TO RI'S WEBSITE, THE ROTARY PEACE CENTERS WERE CREATED IN 2002 TO IDENTIFY AND TRAIN HIGHLY QUALIFIED PROFESSIONALS TO BECOME AGENTS OF PEACE. THE PURPOSE OF THESE "AGENTS OF PEACE" IS TO: PROMOTE NATIONAL AND INTERNATIONAL COOPERATION, PEACE, AND THE SUCCESSFUL RESOLUTION OF CONFLICT THROUGH THEIR SERVICE ACTIVITIES.

EACH YEAR, ROTARY AWARDS UP TO 130 FULLY FUNDED FELLOWSHIPS FOR DEDICATED LEADERS FROM AROUND THE WORLD TO STUDY AT ONE OF OUR PEACE CENTERS. THROUGH ACADEMIC TRAINING, PRACTICE, AND GLOBAL NETWORKING OPPORTUNITIES, THE ROTARY PEACE CENTERS PROGRAMS TRAIN "THE AGENTS OF PEACE" TO BECOME PROFESSIONALS OR PRACTITIONERS IN BEING EFFECTIVE CATALYSTS FOR PEACE. THE FELLOWSHIPS COVER TUITION AND FEES, ROOM AND BOARD, ROUND-TRIP TRANSPORTATION, AND ALL INTERNSHIP AND FIELD-STUDY EXPENSES.

SINCE THE PROGRAM BEGAN IN 2002, THE ROTARY PEACE CENTERS HAVE TRAINED MORE THAN 1,400 PEACE FELLOWS WHO NOW WORK IN MORE THAN 115 COUNTRIES. MANY SERVE AS LEADERS IN GOVERNMENTS, NGOS, THE MILITARY, EDUCATION, LAW ENFORCEMENT, AND INTERNATIONAL ORGANIZATIONS LIKE THE UNITED NATIONS AND THE WORLD BANK. EACH YEAR TRF AWARDS UP TO 50 FELLOWSHIPS FOR MASTER'S DEGREES AND 80 FOR CERTIFICATE STUDIES AT PREMIER UNIVERSITIES IN 7 COUNTRIES: ENGLAND, THAILAND, UNITED STATES, JAPAN, AUSTRALIA, SWEDEN AND THE MOST RECENT, UGANDA IN EAST AFRICA.

WE BELIEVE THAT ONE MUST LIVE ONE'S LIFE WITH COMPASSION. OUR WISH IS THAT, AS CITIZENS OF THE WORLD, WE CAN CREATE A SOCIETY WHERE PEOPLE OF ALL REGIONS IN THE WORLD ESTEEM AND CARE FOR OTHERS. Afghanistan No new Wild Polio cases reported this past week. One Wild Polio case reported in 2021 The most recent case had an onset of paralysis on 1/19/21. Afghanistan reported 56 Wild Polio cases in 2020. No Polio-Positive Environmental Samples were reported this week in Afghanistan.
