

President Carrie Donaire took inspiration from Rotary International's Areas of Focus, the collaboration between our club and several others in providing greenhouses to Oaxaca, Mexico, as well as her Peace Corps service, which was done in Nicaragua, back in 2003. Though it was many years ago, this service served as a guiding light and helped catalyze her Presidential Project for her year. Donaire wanted to look at creating a chance to explore sustainable solutions to food challenges in our community. Out of her idea, the Food Security Summit was born. The Food Security Summit was held on Thursday, March 27, at Clinton Community College's Career Advancement Center. On Monday, she gave us a rundown of what the summit was all about.

The committee was formed last fall and consisted of: Emily Webb, Althea Cahoy, Heather Christensen, Carrie Donaire, Andy Green, and Susie Mesecher (all photographed to the right). Not pictured: Michele Cullan, Regan Michaelsen, Lisa Toppert, and Sarah Saionz.



The Summit had about 60 participants and consisted of workshops from Keynote Speaker, Emily Webb, a technology transactions attorney and the current chair of the Polk County Hospital Board of Trustees. Information, Referral and Assistance Services Executive Director Regan Michaelsen facilitated another workshop. "We really wanted to get the right people in the room," explained Donaire. "We really want people who have some expertise in this area, or their organization is already doing something, or there's a program that they can come back to their organization and say, 'This is what it was all about. I made a new connection today -- I'm looking for food, they're looking for where to donate their food.'"

Donaire summarized her presentation and stated, "Like I said I was hoping it was going to be this little neat tidy project and tie it off within the Rotary year, but instead of being the end of the project, it's the beginning. I feel really good about that, because I think there is interest from these organizations to continue to get together and to work together... This is not what we will do as an organization, but we can certainly put some 'oomph' behind it and help coordinate a quarterly meeting." The next meeting will be on June 10th at CCC's Career Advancement Center. Additional next steps are through fellow Rotarian Marsha Thrall, who will be making connections through the Lyons Farmers Market, as well as continued support from Rotary. Another key next step will be creating a resource map and working on eliminating barriers and finding solutions for our community. Stay tuned for more!
