





#### **BRAYDON ROBERTS**



#### Q: HOW LONG HAVE YOU BEEN A MEMBER OF THE ROTARY CLUB OF CLINTON?

A: NEARLY 2 AND A HALF YEARS.

A: I JOINED ROTARY A FEW MONTHS AFTER MOVING TO THE COMMUNITY. IT GAVE ME AN OPPORTUNITY TO MEET MORE PEOPLE IN THE COMMUNITY. I ALSO LIKED JOINING A GROUP THAT FOCUSED ON HELPING THE COMMUNITY THROUGH SERVICE.

#### Q: WHAT IS YOUR CURRENT OCCUPATION?

A: ATTORNEY AT FREY, HAUFE, & CURRENT PLC IN CLINTON.

#### Q: WHAT DO YOU LOVE MOST ABOUT YOUR JOB?

A: THAT MY CLIENTS ARE DIVERSE. I HAVE REPRESENTED CLIENTS WITH MORE MONEY THAN I WILL LIKELY EVER HAVE, CLIENTS WITH HARDLY ANYTHING, AND MANY MORE INBETWEEN. INTERACTING WITH THEM HELPS ME BETTER UNDERSTAND THE PROBLEMS OUR CITY AND SOCIETY FACE.

#### Q: WHAT'S ONE THING - EITHER INDUSTRY-RELATED OR NOT - YOU LEARNED IN THE LAST MONTH?

A: THAT WE AREN'T SAFE FROM SNOW EVEN IN MID TO LATE APRIL.

#### Q: WHAT'S THE LAST BOOK YOU READ?

A: OATHBRINGER BY BRANDON SANDERSON

Q: YOU'RE A NEW ADDITION TO THE CRAYON BOX. WHAT COLOR WOULD YOU BE AND WHY?

INSTEAD, HE KEEPS SHOWING UP TO WORK EVERYDAY BECAUSE HE STILL ENJOYS PRACTICING LAW. HE OFTEN TRIES TO HELP POTENTIAL CLIENTS THAT OTHER OFFICES HAVE DECLINED TO REPRESENT BECAUSE HE SEES THEY STILL HAVE A PROBLEM AND KNOWS IF HE SAYS NO THAT NO ONE ELSE WILL HELP THEM. HE'S ALSO STILL ACTIVE IN ROTARY AND IN TRYING TO HELP HIS COMMUNITY.

#### Q: WHAT'S SOMETHING ABOUT YOU (A FUN FACT) THAT NOT MANY PEOPLE KNOW?



YOUTH SERVICE STRENGTHENS THE ABILITY OF COMMUNITIES TO SUPPORT BASIC EDUCATION, LITERACY AND TO REDUCE GENDER DISPARITY IN EDUCATION. ROTARY CLUBS ALL OVER THE WORLD SPONSOR YOUTH SERVICE PROGRAMS SUCH AS ROTARACT, INTERACT, RYLA, AND YOUTH EXCHANGE.

#### NO NEW WILD POLIO CASES REPORTED THIS WEEK!

WHAT IS THAT POLIO PICTURE? THIS PICTURE SHOWS DR LEONE FARRELL, PHD. DR FARRELL, WAS ONE ONE OF THE MANY FEMALE SCIENTISTS WHO RECEIVED LESS THAN APPROPRIATE RECOGNITION FOR THEIR CONTRIBUTIONS TO SCIENCE. DR FARRELL WAS A KEY FIGURE IN THE SUCCESSFUL MASS PRODUCTION OF THE POLIO VACCINE, ENABLING JONAS SALK AND HIS TEAM TO CREATE ENOUGH SERUM TO PERFORM THE INITIAL POLIO VACCINE TRIALS IN 1954. © SANOFI PASTEUR CANADA ARCHIVES VACCINE HAVE PREVENTED ABOUT 10 MILLION DEATHS FROM DISEASE SINCE 1963. RESEARCHERS ESTIMATE. ROTARY MEMBERS KNOW THE POWER OF VACCINATION WELL: THE ORAL POLIO VACCINE HAS HELPED BRING CASES OF WILD POLIO DOWN 99.9 PERCENT SINCE 1988, WITH THE VIRUS REMAINING ENDEMIC IN ONLY TWO COUNTRIES TODAY. AND NOW, AS COVID-19 VACCINES ARE BEING DISTRIBUTED AROUND THE WORLD, THE EXPERIENCE AND KNOWLEDGE THAT ROTARY AND ITS PARTNERS IN THE GLOBAL POLIO ERADICATION INITIATIVE HAVE GAINED ARE HELPING PROTECT COMMUNITIES FROM THE PANDEMIC. FOUR WPV1 & CVDPV2 POSITIVE ENVIRONMENTAL SAMPLES WERE REPORTED THIS WEEK IN PAKISTAN. AFGHANISTAN NO NEW WILD POLIO CASES REPORTED THIS WEEK. ONE WILD POLIO CASE REPORTED IN 2021 THE MOST RECENT CASE HAD AN ONSET OF PARALYSIS ON 1/01/21. AFGHANISTAN REPORTED 56 WILD POLIO CASES IN 2020. NO WPV1 & CVDPV2-POSITIVE ENVIRONMENTAL SAMPLES WERE REPORTED THIS WEEK IN AFGHANISTAN. OUR GOAL IS GLOBAL POLIO ERADICATION!!
