

# THE WEEKLY ROUND-UP



We had the honor of having Michele Cullen, Community Health Manager with Community Health/ Genesis VNA join our virtual Rotary meeting this past Monday. Clinton County has had 50 positive COVID-19 viruses, with 43 recovered. Michele discussed her role with reporting COVID positive results and what she does in public health, including reaching out to businesses and schools that need guidance or

assistance in following protocols, through numerous phone calls and emails.Michele briefly discussed a fear that she has, which is common for all of us -- that reopening will lead to higher numbers of positive cases. She stated one of the mottos she remembers is hope for the best, but plan for the worse. During our Q&A session, Michele commented, "We are in what I call the new normal. I think it will be a long time before we have things back, or if we ever have things back, before they were prior to March 1. But I think it's important that you keep reinforcing that social distancing."

Michele also discussed the testing measures that the State of Iowa has gone through. "When we first started this, we had very limited testing in the State of Iowa, but now that we've gotten into this, our testing has grown. In Eastern Iowa, in Clinton County, we have a lot of testing available."

### FOUNDATION MINUTE

Welcome to May, **Rotary's New Generation Month!** This Rotary month is dedicated to the young and youth services, with special focus on the activities of Interact and Rotaract Clubs.

While school related activities involving youth are mostly suspended due to COVID-19, there are several ways that Rotarians and youth involved in Interact and Rotaract are doing their best to make the world a better place. Virtual meetings are being held. Donations from Rotarians are being given to food pantries with the source of funds being the money that would have been spent on weekly meal tickets. During this time TRF continues to aid clubs in their individual projects. One of such club project is the Rotary Club of Metro Bethesda, MD, which has donated \$53,000 to support three local nonprofit organizations focused on the frontline responders to the Covid-19 virus. The money will be distributed among the BCC Rescue Squads, Mobile Med and So What Else, a distributor of food, PPE and other essential items. The \$53,000 was funded with contributions from the Metro Bethesda Rotary Foundation, the Rotary Foundation of Washington, Rotary District 7620 and The Rotary Foundation International World Fund.

Rotary District 9211 comprises Rotary Clubs in the East African countries of Tanzania and Uganda. Rotarians in these two nations recently raised the equivalence of \$323,879 (USD) in their fight against infectious diseases. Handing over the check to the Prime Minister of Uganda, the District Governor (District 9211), Francis Xavier Sentame said that Rotarians are people of action and "Rotary is a service organization which puts it at the forefront in the fight against diseases like polio, malaria and now, Covid-19." The \$323,879 is a contribution of Rotary Clubs and other Rotary partners in Uganda and Tanzania, with matching funds from TRF.



#### **The Final Three Polio Endemic Countries:**

- Pakistan No new Polio cases reported this week. Forty-One Polio cases reported in 2020. The most recent cases were from the Balochistan & Sindh Provinces with an onset of paralysis on 03/31/20. Pakistan reported 147 Wild Polio cases in 2019. Six new Polio-Positive Environmental Samples were reported this week in Pakistan.
- Afghanistan One new Polio case reported this past week. Five Polio cases reported in 2020. The most recent case was from the Laghman Province with an onset of paralysis on 2/28/20. Afghanistan reported twenty-nineWild Polio cases in 2019. One Polio-Positive Environmental Sample was reported this week in Afghanistan.
- Nigeria No Wild Polio cases have been reported in 2017, 2018, or 2019. Nigeria is to be congratulated on over Three Years without a Wild Polio case!

### VOTING WILL OCCUR AT OUR MONDAY MEETING AND RESULTS WILL BE RELAYED TO DISTRICT GOVERNOR ERNA MORAIN.

In accordance with RI procedures, each issue will be considered adopted, unless I receive a majority of negative votes before the deadline. I believe each of the three issues should be noncontroversial and should be approved, but we do require a vote to be taken. The three issues are as follows:

### Approve \_\_\_\_ Disapprove \_\_\_\_

1. To approve moving the western boundary line of District 6000 to encompass Crawford County, Iowa so that the Rotary Club of Denison can officially become a member of our district. We previously held a vote of unanimous approval to sanction the move, and the Rotary International board now requires the approval of both districts to sanction the boundary change.

### Approve \_\_\_\_ Disapprove \_\_\_\_

2. To approve Past District Governor John Ockenfels to serve as a member, and PDG Chris Knapp as the alternate, on the Zone 29 nominating committee which will select a new International Director to represent our Zone on the RI board. Both are qualified under the RI guidelines to serve in that capacity and have been duly nominated to serve. The positions require that the one serving must be a past district governor.

### Approve \_\_\_\_ Disapprove \_\_\_\_

3. To approve a District 6000 representative and an alternate to serve on the Rotary International Council on Legislation for the 2020-23 term. Past District Governor Susan Herrick is currently serving as the District 6000 representative, and she is willing to serve one more term. PDG Chris Knapp has agreed to serve as alternate, replacing PDG Jacque Andrew, who declined to accept another term. Both are qualified under RI rules to serve in their capacities, as both are past district governors.
